A MESSAGE FROM THE WEBER BASIN WATER CONSERVANCY DIST ABOUT OUR WATER SUPPLY

All reservoirs were filled this year and since about the 1st of July water has been pulled out of reservoir storage for use. As of July 13 all reservoirs were above 90% full. With the warmer than average weather over the past month, water use is noticeably higher in general than has been seen in recent memory. In order to successfully conserve a portion of this year's healthy runoff, please look for any opportunity to save some water in a continuing and habitual manner. Davis Weber Counties Canal Company- Guidelines for Watering

Please water at the most, once every 3 days throughout the summer. This will encourage your lawn's roots to go deeper and you won't overwater. As things cool off again, around Labor Day, adjust your watering schedule to once every 5 days. We encourage you to shut off sprinklers when it rains; just skipping one watering cycle saves thousands of gallons. 2017 ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The Roundabout on 2300 N 1500 W will be closed for approximately three weeks beginning in early August to allow for reconstruction of the road and replacement of the water line. During construction there will be detour routes established around the construction.

Crews are working hard to complete other projects throughout the rest of the City. Your cooperation and patience throughout this process is greatly appreciated.

The majority of the projects include replacing the water line prior to the asphalt work.

Hunter Education Class

Step 2: Pay \$10 at Clinton Rec. After registration, begin online portion of course which may take 10-12 hours to complete.

Step 3: Attend field day class and range day. Bring receipt from Clinton City, voucher and all internet tests or completion certificate to field day class. **All tests must be 100% correct. BRING YOUR CASSED .22 RIFLE. NO AMMUNITION.**

CONTACT FOOTBALL DEADLINE is JULY 7TH!! NO late registrations. Only COMPLETE packets are accepted. WE ARE NOT PROVIDING PHYSICAL EXAMS THIS YEAR. Ages 7-15, must weigh at least 40 lbs and not be registered for high school. Cost is \$110. Packets can be picked up at Recreation or online and must be completed upon registration.

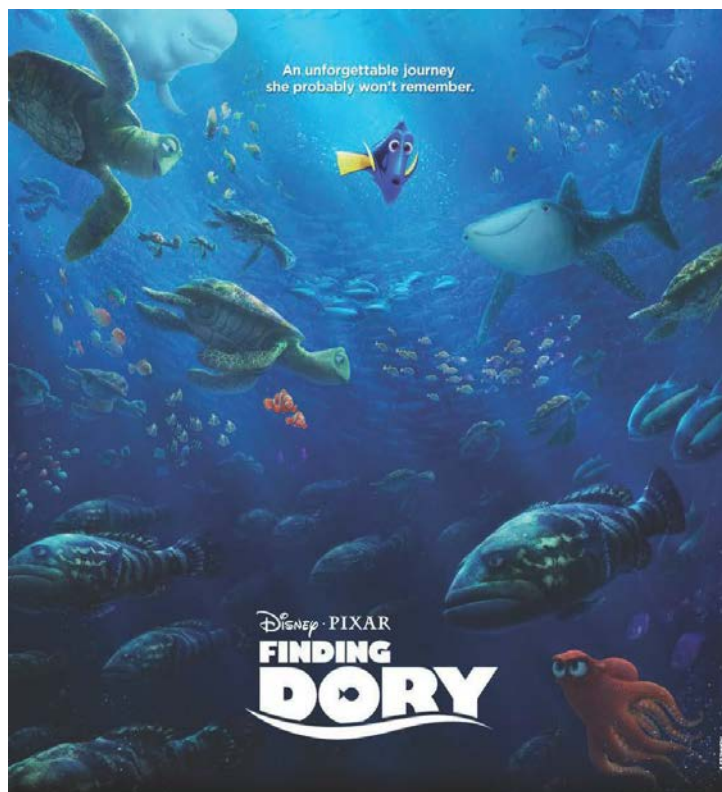

This month's luncheon will be held on August 16th, at 12 Noon! Clinton City Recreation 1651 W 2300 N, \$3 optional donation for lunch.

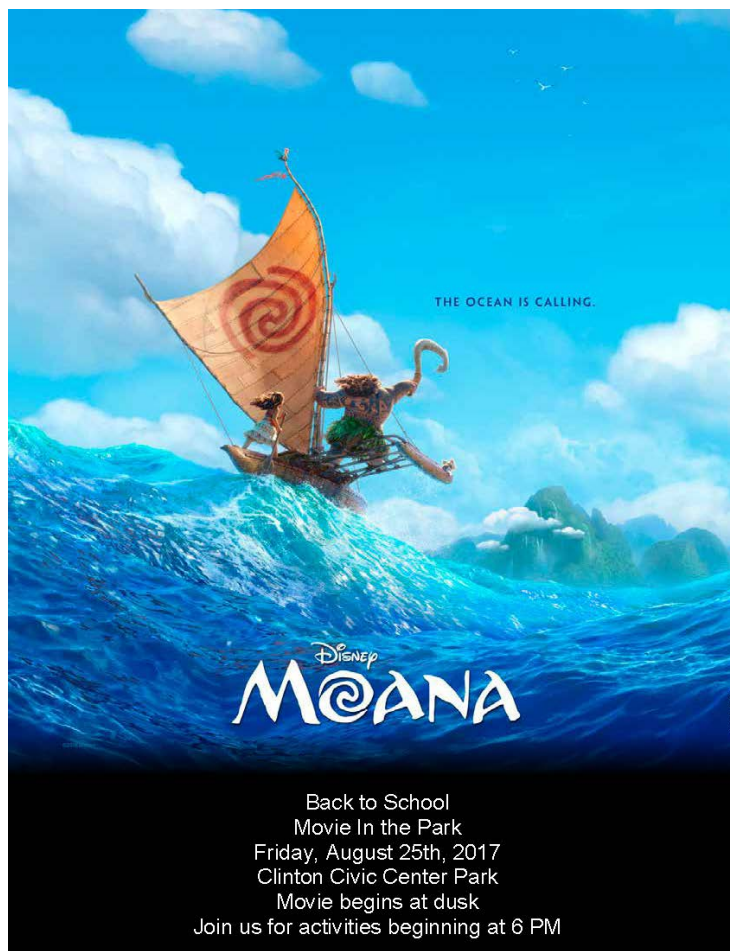
