CLINTON CITY BUSINESS LICENSE INFO

As of April 1, 2018, all businesses that have not renewed their business license for the 2018 business year will be considered to be operating a business without a business license, subject to criminal prosecution for every day of operation after January 1.

It is a Class B Misdemeanor to operate a business without a current business license, so if you are still operating a business please contact the Community Development Department as soon as possible to avoid a citation.
