## Stunning Containers and Pots

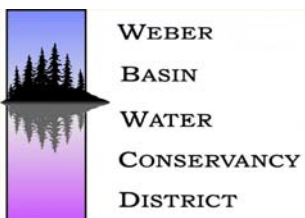
**Saturday, April 17th**
