Motion by Terry to approve the last minutes; seconded by Jason. Motion carried.

UPDATES

- 1) Pickle Ball Courts – Mr. Cluff said that the contract has been signed and everything is ready to go. When the frost is gone, the work will begin and should be finished and ready to be used in the fall. There is still no decision on what lights to use on the courts.
- 2) Broadband – Mr. Cluff said that there are now 7 parks connected to the broadband program. It is being updated with antennas, posts, etc. There is good reception too. The company will maintain and work on the system for the next 3 years and after that, the City will take control.
- 3) Veteran's Park – Mr. Cluff said that the new plaques will be 6"x3" and two will fit in the size space of one brick. They will be put in the top layer of the walls, equal on both sides. The cost will be \$20 to \$25 for the plaques. The order form will have to be revised and that can be done in-house. Justin suggested that we have a sample of the plaque, along with the updated order form, for our booth at Heritage Days. It was suggested that people could buy 2 plaques, one for the wall and one for their own personal use.
- 4) Disc Golf – Jason said that he's been cleaning the tee pads after snowfalls. The course is still being used during the winter, with people sledding and people playing working together. He would like to see more baskets installed periodically. The course seems to "police" itself with very little trash. He'd like to see more signage warning people of safety, etc. Jason also said that he would order more promo discs if Heritage Days is approved.

Mr. Cluff said that Heritage Days would be the second week of July (July 9th & 10th). It is being planned for but will have to see how the Covid numbers go in the next few months regarding restrictions on crowd size.
