BOARD REAPPOINTMENTS

Reappointments to the Board for Bev Lambdin, Scott Bailey, and Terry Tremea were approved at the April 23rd City Council meeting.

DISC GOLF

Mr. Cluff said that the signs are being made as a scout project. He checked with Zac and told Zac to contact Jason with the scout information and then have Jason coordinate with the scout to get the signs done and installed. Kent said that he has talked to 5 or 6 people and they all thought the course and project was great. Mr. Cluff said that Recreation is setting up classes also for teaching the game.

MISCELLANEOUS

A) The Parks Board has a booth for Heritage Days, with electricity. We will have a disc golf demonstration, with mini-Frisbees to be handed out. Bev will get the information for the Weber Water Conservancy District handouts. Mr. Cluff said that there's been a hold up on the concrete for the Veteran's Park project due to the rain, but he hoped to have it all completed in time for the breakfast during Heritage Days and the Board could have a celebration during the breakfast.

B) Karen Peterson appeared regarding the planned Day of Service set for June 29th. She said that the city is sponsoring this event. There are 2 opportunities: people can set up their own project, or they can join the projects at Heritage and Civic Center parks, spreading mulch. If people want to do their own projects, they must register on the city's web site. If it is a major project, the city can provide dumpsters and access to the Public Works yard. She said that she has talked to the LDS leaderships in the city, as well as scout groups, CERT, and the youth council. She has also posted information on social media, the newsletter, and the electric sign on 1800 North. If people want to spread the mulch, it will be done between 8 AM and 12:00 noon. Mr. Cluff said that he would like to see neighborhoods help the elderly in their area with projects on their homes and/or landscaping. Maybe a challenge could be made to the veterans in the city to work on the Veteran's Park. Karen said that she would like feedback also so they can use it

for next year's Day of Service. She said that they plan on handing out water and popsicles, and taking pictures to put on the city's website.

C) Kent said there is still an ongoing battle between Parks and Recreation to get the ball fields improved. Mr. Cluff said that he is working with the city staff on guidelines and better communication. He will check on them and follow-up with Kent's concerns.

D) Terry suggested an idea for historical signs to be installed around the city. He presented a picture of what Roy City has done. The Board would have to check on prices, information, etc. before making any decisions.

E) Newsletter – Inform neighbors of parks that they can use that as their Day of Service project, but be sure to register on the web site. It might lead to neighborhoods adopting the park that's nearest their homes.

The next Board meeting will be on **June 19, 2019 at 7:00 PM.**

We will finalize our Heritage Days plans and set up assignments for the Board members.
