SALES AND DISCHARGE DATES

Sales

Class "C" fireworks can be sold the following dates:

June 24 – July 25
December 29 – December 31st
2 days before and on Chinese New Year's Eve

Discharge

Between the hours of 11am and 11pm except as noted:

July 2 – July 5
(July 4 hours extended to midnight)

July 22 – 25
(July 24 hours extended to midnight)

December 31*
(11am – 1am Jan. 1)

Chinese New Year's Eve
(11am – 1am the following day)

*If New Year's eve is on a Sunday and the county, municipality, or metro township determines to celebrate New Year's eve on the prior Saturday (Dec 30), then a person may discharge Class C common state approved explosives on that prior Saturday within the county, municipality, or metro township.

FIREWORKS SAFETY

Clinton City does not have any Firework Restrictions in place at this time. However, in a proactive approach to preventing fires, we ask the public to exercise good firework safety practices and common sense. Use extra caution around open fields and the walking trail due to the high fuel levels and the decreasing fuel moisture content.

Firework safety tips:

- Purchase fireworks from reliable, licensed fireworks dealers. Read all instructions to reduce the chances of a destructive fire or debilitating injury.
- Follow all safety guidelines exactly. Children should not handle fireworks. You must be at least 16 years of age to handle or light fireworks. Adults are to supervise any activity that includes fireworks.
- Never let children handle, play with or light fireworks. Only knowledgeable and clear-headed adults should handle fireworks.
- Adults should never use alcohol or drugs or be impaired while engaged in handling, using, placing or lighting fireworks.
- Aerial devices need at least 30 foot clearance around on the ground and as much as 150 feet in the air.
- Never shoot fireworks in windy conditions.
- Keep a bucket of water or running hose nearby during the time of lighting and disposing of fireworks and in case of an emergency.
- Use caution with animals. Excitement, noise and lights can cause fear and stress.

Contact Football: **DEADLINE JULY 6TH!!** NO late registrations. Only COMPLETE packets are accepted. Contact Football: Ages 7-15, must weigh at least 40 lbs and not be registered for high school. Cost is \$110. Packets can be picked up in our office or found online and must be completed to register.

Flag Football: Co-ed ages 1st-9th grade. Cost is \$50 resident and \$55 non-resident. Registration includes a game jersey and 8 games, the **deadline is July 27th** and drafts will be held Tuesday, August 14th. Practices will begin the week of August 20st.

A Message from the Davis County Health Department

There have been a number of complaints in the area regarding rats.

The Division of Environmental Health recommends the following procedures to eliminate and discourage rats from your property:

- Remove piles of garden and yard wastes, aka dead vegetation.
- Keep sheds and outbuildings clean.
- Check woodpiles for rat burrows. Keep woodpiles off the ground to eliminate nesting space.
- Check unused motor vehicles for nesting in the body or engine compartment.
- Keep all garbage or waste in containers with tight fitting lids.
- Pick up dog wastes daily and feed pets only what they will eat. Clean up excess food daily.
- Make sure animal food is either kept secure in the home, or if stored in the garage, a shed, or outdoors is kept in a heavy plastic or galvanized steel containers with tight fitting lids.
- Eliminate any water sources. They only need ½ oz per day.
- If baiting is necessary, follow instructions on the package. This is the law. Bait and bait stationS can be obtained from local stores or farm supply outlets. Rat burrows that are found should be baited and backfilled. If you are unsure how to safely do this, contact a licensed pest controller.
 - Bait can be hazardous to pets.
- Mechanical traps can also be effective when used properly.
- If residents wish to file a complaint of rats, contact our office at 801-525-5100. <http://www.daviscountyutah.gov/health/environmental-health-services/housing/vectors-new/rats-and-mice>. Bait stations are no longer available through the County.

A Message from the Davis Weber Canal Company

Good news! The large reservoirs (Echo & East Canyon) were filled despite the bleak snowpack; spring showers also helped. We encourage wise water use throughout the hot summer. What we save now will help us fill the reservoirs next year. One way to water your landscaping more efficiently is to get a ‘smart controller’ that will adjust how often your sprinklers run based on the weather. Go to UtahWaterSavers.com for details on a rebate up to 50% (up to \$150).

“Smart Watering” is using a weather-based controller, and applying the proper amount of water (proper sprinkler coverage, zone run times and reduce overspray). More information and links can be found on our website at www.davisweber.org .

Joanne was raised in Sunset City and Ross grew up in Wilson Lane (West Haven), Utah. Ross and Joanne were married in the Logan LDS Temple on March 24, 1972. They moved to Clinton in 1974, where they raised 5 children: 3 girls and 2 boys. Ross taught the kids how to work hard by teaching them to plant their garden, mow their lawn and other fun things. He has been the rock that keeps their family together. Ross is the one that their family turns to, because he is always willing to help others. He is now teaching his grandchildren how to play and work hard.

While their children were in school Joanne went back to school and received her Bachelor's Degree from Weber State in Social Work and Child and Family Studies. She went on to receive two Masters Degree from the University of Utah in Social Work and Educational Counseling all while recovering from a spiral fracture, she received in a water fight at girls camp, this fracture required her to have a steel rod in her leg and she had to use a cane to walk. Joanne was an elementary school counselor in the Davis School District for 15 years. Six of which were at Parkside Elementary, where she was known as "The Chocolate Lady." She retired from the school district in 2014. Former students stop her quite often to reminisce and thank her for her help and love.

Joanne served the special needs community for over 25 years. While serving there she helped them put on plays and productions, she was their camp director and helped the shy children learn to speak in public. Working with this community helped her see what Heaven is like and realize the special needs community is a Heaven on Earth.

Ross and Joanne served two missions for the LDS Church. The first one was on a Navajo Reservation Chinle Arizona. While there they served the people and volunteered at the school. Their second mission was in Pulaski, Tennessee, where they helped support the members in that area.

Joanne loves Clinton City and served on the Planning Commission for 13 years where she helped plan the city's infrastructure and helped the City/School Coordination Committee plan sidewalks and roadways so children could get to school safely. Joanne also served on the City Council for 16 years where she helped put the Recreation Program together and was instrumental in helping get the Youth City Council where it is today. Ross has supported Joanne in all the city activities she gets involved with.
