RESIDENTIAL FENCING REQUIREMENTS

This information is being provided to assist homeowners in understanding the City requirements for installing fences on residential lots. All projects for residential fencing require a Compliance Permit, except where noted, to be issued from the Community Development Department. There is no fee for a Compliance Permit.

- Fences in front yards cannot exceed 4 feet in height.
- Fences in side or rear yards cannot exceed 6 feet in height.
- On corner lots, a solid fence cannot exceed 2 feet tall within the 40 foot clear view triangle.
- Fences cannot be installed on a public right of way which, in developed subdivisions, begins 1 foot inside (toward your home) from the sidewalk.
- The materials used to construct the fence need to be those which are commonly intended for typical fence installation.
- Fences in residential areas cannot be electrified, constructed of barbed wire, or other materials which may be hazardous to citizens.
- The height of a fence which is installed on a retaining wall will be measured from a point which is half-way between the top of the retaining wall and the land or grade on the lower side of the fence.
