A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS

Door hangers for tree/shrub trimming have been being distributed in conjunction with Clinton City Ordinance 25-16-5 "Height Limitations on Park Strip Vegetation". This ordinance identifies that some of the most important reasons for keeping trees trimmed away from the street are to allow access by the street sweeper and snow plows. Trees that are hanging in the streets could cause damage to these vehicles. Areas where there are trees hanging too low will not be swept or plowed. Also it is important to be able to see all regulatory (Stop) and caution signs for safety purposes.

Trees should not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or the sidewalk eight (8) feet. Please give Public Works a call with questions or concerns on this matter at 801-614-0870 Monday thru Friday from 7 am to 3:30 pm.

CERT NEWS

In September, Cert will be introducing a New Cert Online Training. This course is free. We feel this would be an advantage to those who work or attend school. Participants will be able to access the training on their mobile device or computer.

Participants complete the course at their own pace and convenience. The online course takes 9 hrs and then the in person practical training part takes another 16 hrs. After completion, training will be followed up by in-person hands on practical training by Certified Cert Team members. This consists of splinting, bandaging, recognizing the three killers and treating each one; search and rescue techniques and fire suppression safety.
