Voting & COVID 19



Changes to Voting

The State Legislature passed HB3006 during a special session on April 22, 2020. This bill made substantial changes to how the Primary Election is administered.

- No Early Voting
- No In-Person Voter Registration
- No Election Day Voter Registration
- Limited Election Day Voting
- Ballots may only be sent to voters affiliated with a participating party or to unaffiliated voters who qualify and have requested a ballot.

Traditional Polling Locations will not be available for the June Primary.
All voters are encouraged to vote by mail

Primary Election

- Ballots will be mailed beginning June 9, 2020
- Ballots must be postmarked by June 30th.
- Return your ballot early, recommended mail by date is no later than June 26th.

Vote by Mail



There will be only one polling location on Election Day of the Davis County Legacy Center 151 South 1100 West, Farmington.

This will be a drive-thru only location. This location is established to assist voters with disabilities or voters who have not received a ballot in the mail.
If you can vote by mail, please do.

Prepare for the Election Now

1. Register to vote, or make sure your voter registration is current today. Visit www.VoteUtah.gov
2. Learn about the Candidates. Visit www.DavisVotes.com
3. Vote and return your ballot when it arrives the week of June 9, 2020

In a Primary Election

Party Affiliation Matters

If you want to participate in the Democratic Primary you must be registered Democratic, or registered as Unaffiliated and request a Democratic ballot. (if Congressional District only)

If you want to participate in the Republican Primary you must be registered Republican.

ROUND A BOUT INFO

Round-a-bouts in Clinton City provide safer and more efficient traffic flow than standard intersections. They keep traffic moving one-way in a counterclockwise direction, providing for fewer conflict points which allows traffic to flow more smoothly.

Follow these steps for driving in the round-a-bouts:

- Slow down and obey traffic signs;
- Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists;
- **Yield to traffic already in the round-a-bout;**
- Enter the round-a-bout when there is a safe gap in traffic;
- Keep your speed low within the round-a-bout;
- As you approach your exit, turn on your right turn signal.

Contact Football Registration

Registration starts for contact football begins June 1st and runs through July 2nd. **NO LATE REGISTRATIONS!**

League rules require that participants must register in the city in which they live. Contact Football: Ages 7-15, must weigh at least 40 lbs and not in be in high school. Cost is \$110. Packets can be picked up in the Recreation office or found online and must be completed and all documentation provided at the time of registration.

Flag Football Registration

Registration starts for Flag football Jun 1st and runs thru Jul 31st. Flag Football: Co-ed ages 1st-9th grade. Cost is \$50 resident and \$55 non-resident. The season runs August – October.

Fall Soccer Registration

Registration runs from June 1st – July 17th. Cost is \$50.00 for Residents and \$55.00 for Non-Residents. The season runs August - October. Youth ages 4 (preschool – must start kindergarten fall of 2019) to 9th grade.
