The Master Ballot Position is determined by the Lt. Governor's office in accordance with Utah State Code 20A-6-305.

The 2021 Clinton City Municipal Election will be conducted as Vote by Mail in coordination with the Davis County Clerk/Auditor. For information on Vote by Mail & Voter Registration ([click here](#)). For those who wish to vote early, ballots can be dropped off in a secure drop box in the Recreation Department parking lot 1651 W 2300 N prior to the election. For those who wish to vote in person, a polling location will be available at Clinton City Recreation on August 10, 2021 for the Primary Election and on Nov 2, 2021 for the General Election from 7 am to 8pm.

A friendly reminder that recreational vehicles are not permitted to be stored or parked on City streets. Recreational vehicle (RV) includes but are not limited to, travel trailers, camping trailers, motor homes, or fifth wheel trailers. If preparing for a trip with your RV requires parking in the street of 24 hours, you must obtain prior approval from the Police Department. Please call them at (801) 614-0800 or after hours non-emergency dispatch at (801) 451-4151. Parking of recreational vehicles, travel or camping trailers, or fifth wheels must be on a hard-surface (or concrete) and **be completely on your own property**. Overhang of the vehicle onto sidewalks is in violation of City Code.

FIREWORKS SAFETY & PROTOCOLS

Fireworks are a huge concern this year due to the extreme heat/extreme drought conditions. Though there is not a city-wide ban on fireworks, there are some important prohibitions that you should be aware of. You may not use or project fireworks in, over, across or onto public parks, public property or property other than your own. Use must be at least 20 feet away from any residence or other structure. You may not toss fireworks at people and neither at nor from a vehicle. In addition, for added safety, keep a large bucket of water available in which to put the used fireworks casings, packages, used sparklers, etc.... Pick up all the fireworks trash and put it in the water bucket and soak them for a few hours before throwing them away in a garbage can. Be smart and be safe!

Fall Soccer Registration



Calvin Naluai was nominated to be the Grand Marshal for the 2021 Clinton City Heritage Days Parade for the service he renders to his neighbors and his positive disposition. The nominator states, “Calvin never tires in his dedication to our community and his contributions make our Clinton Community a better place to live!”

Born and raised in Honolulu, Hawaii, to parents of 12 children, and at least 6 foster children, Calvin is number 7. Calvin completed his general education in Honolulu (currently known as BYU-Hawaii). He served a two and a half year mission in the Northern Far East mission (Japan). And, like all of his older siblings, he served time in the US Army. He earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Management from BYU, Provo.

Calvin met his dear wife Elaine on the beach in Hawaii where she was visiting for a prolonged stay. Calvin followed her to Utah and they were married in the Salt Lake Temple.

Calvin hired on with JCPenney Co. and then made a career change to a position with the State government. In October of 1976, he and Elaine purchased a home here in Clinton in a new developing community amongst the Patterson's corn and potato fields. Where they still live among neighbors they call very amazing, wonderful and special people who have become forever friends.

After 33 years with the Utah State Department of Health, Bureau of Finance, Calvin retired. He says Elaine's uncle Harold taught him what retirement should be like: “You wake up in the morning with nothing to do. You go to bed at night and it's not done yet!” He says he hasn't learned that quite yet.

Although at times, during the cold winter months, Calvin and Elaine may reminisce of life on the islands and the warm sandy beaches, they say their friends and neighbors make Clinton City their HOME!

The Naluai family consists of 4 boys and their spouses, and 11 grandchildren... so far. Me ke aloha pumehana pau ole!
