The Master Ballot Position is determined by the Lt. Governor's office in accordance with Utah State Code 20A-6-305.

The 2021 Clinton City Municipal General Election will be conducted as Vote by Mail in coordination with the Davis County Clerk/Auditor. For information on Vote by Mail & Voter Registration visit www.DavisVotes.com. For those who wish to vote early, ballots can be dropped off in a secure drop box in the Recreation Department parking lot 1651 W 2300 N prior to the election. Voters can deposit ballots in the drop boxes anytime up until 8:00 pm on Election Day. If voters put their ballot in the mail, it is recommended that they mail them by the Friday before the Election (October 29). It must be postmarked on or before the Monday (November 1) before the Election to be counted. For those who wish to vote in person, a polling location will be available at Clinton City Recreation on Nov 2, 2021 for the General Election from 7 am to 8pm.

The Board of Canvassers for Clinton City has prepared a report of the election results for the 2021 Municipal Primary Election. Reservations for the City dumpsters are full for the rest of 2021. We will begin taking reservations for March, April and May of 2022 beginning February 1, 2022.

The Davis and Weber Counties Canal Company is planning to shut off their secondary water systems on September 1st due to the extreme drought and limited water resources. The allocated water to the secondary water systems will run out based on our master meters. This is an unprecedented situation. We warn people to not create cross-connections, but we know many will use their culinary water via a hose from their house. For most cities, the culinary water comes from the same source (Weber River) which is depleted. Our canal will most likely still run as several ditches have self-regulated and rationed their water allotment to last longer. We ask for assistance & patience in this matter. Thank you.
