Home fires caused by cooking peak at Thanksgiving and Christmas time. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) from 2014 to 2018, U.S. fire departments responded to an average of 172,900 home structure fires that involved cooking equipment each year. These fires caused an average of 550 civilian fire deaths, 4,820 civilian fire injuries, and more than \$1 billion in direct property damage per year. Below are some cooking safety tips that will help keep you and your family safe this holiday season.

- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you.
- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. Never throw water on a grease fire!
- **For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...** Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire. • Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home.

Cooking brings family and friends together and is a big part of the holiday season. Additionally, people get enjoyment from cooking because it provides an outlet for creativity and can be relaxing. Please be mindful of the hazards associated with cooking and have a safe and wonderful holiday season.

Must possess a valid State of Utah Drivers License. Must pass a pre-employment drug test following a conditional offer of employment. Please be aware of the following Clinton City Code requirements for fall and winter. Thank you for your compliance.

The City Code requires that "All shrubs and trees be pruned to permit plain view of regulatory and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or sidewalk eight (8) feet." Please trim your trees and shrubs now so the snow plows can plow your streets this winter. If you have questions call 801-614-0870, Mon. – Fri. 7 am to 3:30 p.m.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS Ordinance 16-7-19 will go into effect November 15 through March 15. No on street parking including vehicles or trailers is allowed from 12 am to 7 am regardless of the weather.

Also, please keep car doors locked when left outside. Do not start vehicles to warm up and leave them unattended as these provide opportunities for theft.

Connext, a private company is laying fiber internet lines in Clinton. Per utility easement requirements, they are allowed to access portions of your property for this purpose. They place door hangers and knock on doors to alert homeowners. They will replace all landscaping and repair any damages.
