MAYOR'S MINUTE

Thank you for taking a minute to read this. I look forward to providing a quick update once a month on the state of the city.

Water wise, flip the strip, drought, secondary water reduction, hardscape, zero vs xeriscape, secondary water metering, tiered billing and the list goes on and on! As a city we are working hard to tackle these items. We held a city council work session specifically on water issues and look forward to improving our ordinances, providing clarity on landscape standards and aligning billing with usage.

Please join me in NOT watering grass park-strips. Turf park-strips often waste more water than front yards. I know it will be harder to keep the weeds down. It does cost more up front to xeriscape but overtime it will pay back dividends in water savings, less maintenance, reduction of fertilizer run off and better air quality as mowers, edgers and weed eaters operate less.

I am excited to announce that the city council will approve a tentative budget that provides funding for the city to start flipping their strip along with installing smart sprinkler clocks. Public works will establish a few locations of city properties to start this year. Clinton currently doesn't qualify for the Weber Basin Water Conservancy flip the strip rebate. We are working directly with them to see what changes would be acceptable to qualify.

We are all in this together. Every drop counts. Please do what you can to help conserve. Thank you.

PARKS ADVISORY BOARD NEWS The City Council has approved adding alternate basket locations and updating course signage for the Disc Golf Course at Civic Center Park.

This 26 acre park includes a bowery, restrooms, 1/2 mile walking track, baseball fields, basketball courts and our new pickle ball courts, as well as playground equipment. If you haven't stopped by before, please check out this park. The pickle ball courts have become very popular and have been beautifully constructed.

Clinton's Annual Shred Day is on Saturday, May 21, 10:00 am – Noon - 2267 N 1500 W. Clinton residents can bring paper, staples & paperclips, hanging file folders, magazines & phone books, spiral notebooks, two-part equi-fasteners, checks, brass fasteners, brochures and rubber bands to the west side of the city hall parking lot to shred on site.

CONNEXT FIBER – is continuing with installation of fiber in

Clinton City. They are dedicated to restoring each yard to pre fiber installation condition as close as is possible. As secondary water begins to flow, the Connexx Restoration Team (CRT) will be repairing lawns, park strips and other issues they have been notified of.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO SUCCESS

1. Inspect your yard and parking strip for Connexx Fiber yard repairs.
2. Follow Connexx guidelines for watering post construction SOD & seed.
3. If you find a leak that cannot be shut off immediately, report the leak to your secondary water provider at (801) 774-6373.
4. Next call Connexx or fill out the form at <https://www.connexxbroadband.com/restoration> to get on the repair list.
5. Reach out to Connexx Customer Service at (801) 686-2468 to report any other fiber related yard issues that may need attention.

Please be aware, utilities are allowed access to a portion of your property due to a utility easement (please see the graphic below). Thank you!

SECONDARY WATER USE FOR LAWNS AND CULINARY WATER USE SHOULD BE CONSERVED!

PLEASE TURN OFF SPRINKLERS WHEN IT RAINS.

Please reduce secondary water use and limit watering to once a week until Memorial Day, twice a week from Memorial Day to Labor Day, and then back to once a week until the end of the water season which will be October 1st or sooner, depending on water supplies and water use. We do not recommend new landscapes under the circumstances.

WATERING SCHEDULE MEMORIAL DAY to LABOR DAY - If your house number ends in:

0, 1, 2, 3 - Water on Monday and Thursday
 4, 5, 6 - Water on Tuesday and Friday
 7, 8, 9 - Water on Wednesday and Saturday

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services; recent legislation requires all secondary water systems to be fully metered by the end of 2029. We are sending water use reports to those with meters to better educate the user and manage our limited water resources. Please contact (meters@davisweber.org) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly.
