MAYOR'S MINUTE

Utah's unofficial state tree is the Orange Traffic Cone. There will be an abundance popping up in Clinton in 2023. They will be in full bloom for at least two years.

The rumors that 1800 N will have a freeway off ramp, bridge over the train tracks and be widened to 5 lanes from the freeway to 2000 W are coming true. The other long awaited project is the widening of 2000 W from 300 N to approximately Lowes. Both our state roads will be under construction at the same time starting in 2023. We realize this is less than ideal but necessary. As a city we will continue to work closely with UDOT and the project manager to make this upgrade as smooth as possible along with keeping you in the loop.

Our streets crew and contractors are always hard at work! Please thank them for all they do. This week, the Council approved replacing ductile iron pipe, which rusts over time, under 1300 North. This phase will go from the train tracks to 1285 West. We want to be sure it is completed as soon as possible since more traffic will use that road during the 1800 N construction.

Crews are also doing slurry seal around town on surface roads. Chip seals are used on collector roads which makes them more durable. The goal is to do this every 8 to 10 years which prolongs the life of the roads.

A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS

The Water Department is in the process of performing maintenance on fire hydrants throughout the city. Fire hydrant flushing is an important part of our annual maintenance that is usually done once a year. There are two main reasons why hydrants are flushed. First a fire hydrant is in essence a valve and to make sure they work when needed it is important to "exercise" a fire hydrant. Additionally hydrants are flushed to remove mineral deposits that may occur inside the water distribution pipes. City crews are very conscientious about using very little water during this process.

CONNEXT FIBER – is continuing with installation of fiber in Clinton City.

They are dedicated to restoring each yard to pre fiber installation condition as close as is possible. As secondary water begins to flow, the Connex Restoration Team (CRT) will be repairing lawns, park strips and other issues they have been notified of.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO RESOLVE ISSUES

1. Inspect your yard and parking strip for Connex Fiber yard repairs.
2. Follow Connex guidelines for watering post construction SOD & seed.
3. If you find a leak that cannot be shut off immediately, report the leak to your secondary water provider at (801) 774-6373.
4. Next call Connex or fill out the form at <https://www.connexbroadband.com/restoration> to get on the repair list.
5. Reach out to Connex Customer Service at (801) 686-2468 to report any other fiber related yard issues that may need attention.

Please be aware, utilities are allowed access to a portion of your property due to a utility easement. Thank you!

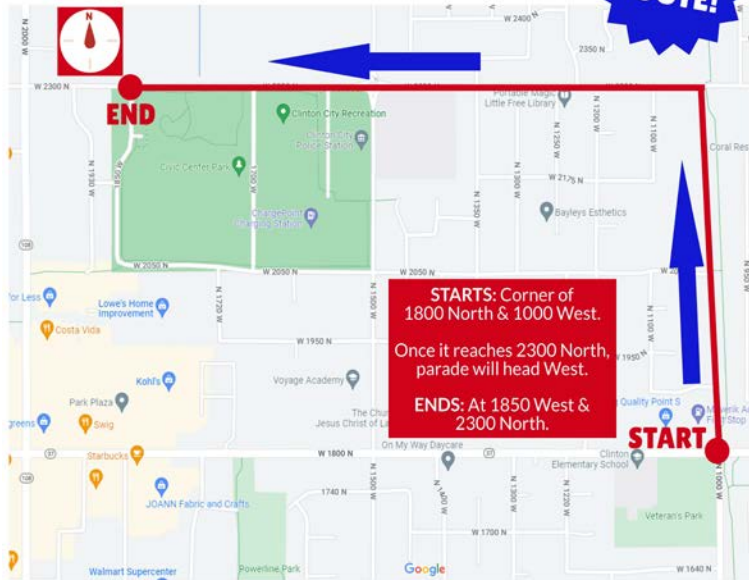

PLEASE TURN OFF SPRINKLERS WHEN IT RAINS.

Please reduce secondary water use and limit watering to once a week until Memorial Day, twice a week from Memorial Day to Labor Day, and then back to once a week until the end of the water season which will be October 1st or sooner, depending on water supplies and water use. We do not recommend new landscapes under the circumstances.

WATERING SCHEDULE MEMORIAL DAY to LABOR DAY -

If your house number ends in:

0, 1, 2, 3 - Water on Monday and Thursday

4, 5, 6 - Water on Tuesday and Friday

7, 8, 9 - Water on Wednesday and Saturday

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services; recent legislation requires all secondary water systems to be fully metered by the end of 2029.
