MAYOR'S MINUTE

Better, different, the same. After any large event, it's important to evaluate the successes and failures. 2022 Clinton City Heritage Days was wonderful! We had five days packed with multiple events to bring the community closer together. It was great seeing neighbors at the park enjoying each other's company and participating in the various activities. The city is lucky to have such hard working staff, parade committee, CERT members and first responders. Without them, Heritage Days would not be possible.

Unfortunately, as many of you were aware, our first responders were called upon numerous times. Saturday night was especially busy. There were multiple fights and two illegal fireworks set off in the crowd at Civic Center Park. Fortunately, no one was seriously injured, but some were hurt and treated on site.

After the firework show and Heritage days had ended, two groups of predominantly minors left the park and headed east on foot. There was an altercation between these groups that resulted in shots being fired and two individuals being transported to the hospital with gunshot wounds. Both individuals survived.

Better- This emergency helped us realize the need for better and more effective information channels. In times of uncertainty and emergencies, the city needs to utilize tools that will push pertinent information to citizens. We will create policies and train over the coming months on the best methods. More information will be sent out as we improve our communication efforts.

Different- We will evaluate the events of Heritage Days to see what may be done differently to help keep it a safe and fun environment for all our citizens to enjoy.

Same- We will continue to have Heritage Days. We love the community feeling and know we are stronger together. Please remember that Clinton is one of the safest cities in Utah. Thank you for supporting our first responders and remember; if you see something, say something.

CERT Training Classes will begin September 13th, 2022 from 6 to 9 pm in the training room at the Clinton Fire station. The training lasts for 7 weeks. CERT members are activated when our professional responders need a trained team to help during search and rescue operations, special events or during a disaster as well as supporting our city with other community projects

The entrance to the training room is around the back of the station; park in the lower parking lot. The door to the training room on the lower-level faces west. Watch for CERT signs.

The first class will include an overview of the course and some background on FEMA.

A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS SEWER DEPARTMENT

Did you know that "flushable" wipes aren't so flushable? Yes, it's true! Those soft and durable moisturized wipes that seem so convenient are wreaking havoc on our sewer system and across the nation. Every year, homeowners and public sewer systems like our own, spend millions of dollars unclogging pipes and repairing damage caused by back-ups resulting from people flushing baby wipes and other wipes marketed as "flushable." Unlike traditional toilet paper, the material used to manufacture these durable, "flushable" wipes does not easily break down in water. Wipes end up tangled together in sewer pipes resulting in blockages. These blockages create significant and costly problems for both residents and our City's sewer system. Please only dispose of body waste and paper in the toilet. Wipes, diapers and feminine hygiene products should be disposed of in a trash can, not a toilet. Thanks for helping us maintain our very important sewerage system.

GRILLING SAFETY TIPS – Follow these tips to stay safe:

- Only grill outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from structures.
- Keep children & pets at least three feet away.
- Keep your grill clean and free from grease buildup.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always open the grill lid before lighting.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill off and wait 5 min before relighting.
- If you smell gas while cooking, move away immediately.

RECEPTIONIST/SECRETARY I/SITE SUPERVISOR This is position works up to 15 hours per week. The Salary Range is \$12.77-\$20.35 per hour DOQ. Incumbents are typically hired at the minimum. This position is responsible for performing a variety of clerical, secretarial, transcription and administrative duties to help support the functions of the recreation department. It provides customer service to the general public and others in person and by phone. The position will be required to supervise a community room rental at least one day of the week/weekend and may be assigned to scorekeep sports games or site supervisor programs at a city park or school gymnasium. Applicants must be 18 or older and possess a valid Utah Driver License; be a high school graduate or equivalent; **AND** have one (1) year of related experience. Experience using Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook; Google is required. Training for other necessary software programs will be provided. Successful applicant must pass a pre-employment drug test. 911 NATIONAL DAY SERVICE 2022

Clinton City, Roy City and West Point City will be teaming up again this year for the 911 National Day of Service. This year there are three service projects planned. Get involved by visiting www.serve911.org to find out all the information for each project.

5K Run - In conjunction with the National Day of Service, a charity 5K run/2 mile walk is being held for the Roy, Clinton, and West Point cities. The proceeds from the run/walk will be donated to local Police and Firefighter charities.

The run/walk is scheduled for September 10, 2022 at 8:00 a.m. The cost is \$20, and will include a free t-shirt to anyone who registers before August 31. The race will begin at Emma Russell Park in southwest Roy, travel into Clinton city, and return to Emma Russell Park to finish.
