PARKS ADVISORY BOARD NEWS

The featured park for September is Powerline Park located at 1660 W 1740 N. This park has a skateboard ramp area, playground equipment, soccer fields, and a walking trail. It also has an RV dump station available adjacent to the park and parking lot. Some improvements and changes will be coming to this park in the near future, watch the newsletter for updates.

Clinton City has been receiving complaints of rodents seeking food and water in residential areas due to drought.

City Code prohibits residents from leaving trash, feces, and other conditions in their yards that would attract creatures and create a nuisance. Please keep your property clean.

Rats in particular can carry human parasites and disease. If you employ traps or pesticides to dispose of them, use caution and wear gloves when handling carcasses. Contact a licensed pest controller for further help.

Follow this Health Department guidance:

- Remove dead vegetation and yard waste.
- Pick up pet waste daily.
- Keep sheds and outbuildings clean.
- Keep wood piles off the ground.
- Store trash in containers with lids
- Store animal food indoors or in thick containers with tight lids.
- Eliminate standing water sources.

The City Code states: "All shrubs and trees shall be pruned to permit plain view of regulatory and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or sidewalk eight (8) feet." Necessary Documentation

- Government issued picture ID.
- Social Security cards for you and EVERYONE living in your household.
- A copy of your utility bills (power and heat).
- Proof of ALL income received by all household members in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of any eligible medical expenses, child support and alimony you paid in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of disability, if applicable.
- Proof of birthdate for a child age five (5) or under.
- Additional documentation, if required.

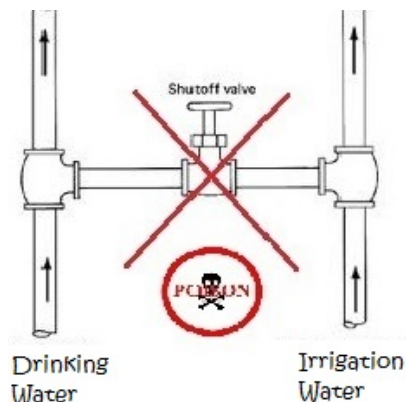

WATER CROSS CONNECTIONS

Due to the drought and high temperatures, some may be tempted to connect the pressure irrigation system (automatic sprinklers) to the culinary (drinking) water supply system. **DON'T DO IT!!** Secondary and Culinary water systems are two completely separate piping systems, connecting the two is illegal and dangerous to the culinary water distribution system throughout the City. This kind of cross connection is a Class C Misdemeanor and will also result in an immediate turn off of culinary water. If you feel you must provide some water to your landscape, use a hose connected to your house's outdoor culinary water spigot. However, please do not use too much, as culinary water is metered and is precious during this drought period.

Warning! To the right is an illegal cross-connection and it is also very dangerous! Never ever connect the drinking water piping to the secondary piping. The pressure in the secondary water system is higher than the pressure in the drinking water system and the secondary water will be forced into the drinking water line.



CONNEXT FIBER – is continuing with installation of fiber in Clinton City. They are dedicated to restoring each yard to pre fiber installation condition as close as is possible. As secondary water begins to flow, the Connex Restoration Team (CRT) will be repairing lawns, park strips and other issues they have been notified of.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO RESOLVE ISSUES

1. Inspect your yard and parking strip for Connex Fiber yard repairs.
2. Follow Connex guidelines for watering post construction SOD & seed.
3. If you find a leak that cannot be shut off immediately, report the leak to your secondary water provider at (801) 774-6373.
4. Next call Connex or fill out the form at <https://www.connexbroadband.com/restoration> to get on the repair list.
5. Reach out to Connex Customer Service at (801) 686-2468 to report any other fiber related yard issues that may need attention.

Please be aware, utilities are allowed access to a portion of your property due to a utility easement. Thank you!

The Clinton City Fire Department encourages all residents to embrace the 2022 Fire Prevention Week theme “Fire won’t wait. Plan your escape.”

It’s important for everyone to plan and practice a home fire escape. Home fires burn hotter and faster than they ever have before with the use of modern-day synthetic materials and plastics. Everyone needs to be prepared in advance, so that they know what to do when the smoke alarm sounds. Given that every home is different, every home fire escape plan will also be different. Have a plan for everyone in the home. Children, older adults, and people with disabilities may need assistance to wake up and get out. Assign someone to help them!

Here are key home fire escape planning tips:

- Make sure your plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- Have a designated outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. It is a good idea to practice at least once during the day and once at night.

The Clinton City Fire Department is hosting it’s annual Fire Prevention Open House on October 6th from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm at the Fire Station. Bring your Family and Friends to learn about fire safety and keeping your family safe. Fire truck rides, paramedic truck, medical helicopters, static displays and so much more! A MESSAGE FROM THE DAVIS WEBER CANAL CO:

We appreciate all of the efforts in using the secondary water wisely per the recommended schedule during this drought. We have seen lower system demands and total volumes compared to other years. As a reminder, after Labor Day, we ask that you water your yard only once a week as per the schedule below.

WATERING SCHEDULE AFTER LABOR DAY

If your house number ends in:

0,1,2,3 Water on Monday or Thursday

4,5,6, Water on Tuesday or Friday

7,8,9 Water on Wednesday or Saturday

The secondary water system will be shut down October 1st, depending on water supplies and water use, it may need to be sooner. Check our website <https://davisweber.org>, for further updates or restrictions. We ask for your patience as we manage a reduced water supply. Please keep praying for a wet fall and snow this winter. Thank you for your assistance.

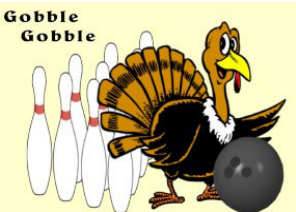

JOB OPENINGS - RECREATION RECEPTIONIST/ SECRETARY I/SITE SUPERVISOR (Part Time, Hourly)

This position works up to 15 hours per week. The Salary Range is \$12.77-\$20.35 per hour. Incumbents are typically hired at the minimum. This position is responsible for performing a variety of clerical, secretarial, transcription and administrative duties to help support the functions of the recreation department, its supervisors and other staff members. Provides customer service to the general public and others; answers incoming phone calls; provides assistance to the public and others; coordinates various office functions and services; process's data; prepares documents and reports. The position will be required to supervise a community room rental at least one day of the week/weekend and may be assigned to score keep sports games or site supervisor programs at a city park or school gymnasium. Applicants: Must be at least 18 years of age or older and be high school graduate or equivalent; AND one (1) year of related experience in secretarial/clerical support work; completion of a post high school training program in secretarial sciences, office management or closely related area; or an equivalent combination of education and experience is preferred. Computer literacy and experience using Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook and Google. Incumbent will be trained how to use other software programs. Must be able to type 45 wpm. Must possess a valid State of Utah Drivers License. Must pass a pre-employment drug test following a conditional offer of employment.
