#### MAYOR'S MINUTE

National Parks are a national treasure and State Parks a state treasure. I feel Clinton City parks and trails are a city treasure. New York may have Central Park but we have Civic Center Park! It makes me happy to see our parks and trails being utilized. Coming together as citizens helps foster community spirit. I loved during summer seeing all 8 pickleball courts full. There was a dedicated group playing a couple weeks ago in the middle of winter. Last month on a Saturday after a large snow storm, I watched around 100 residents sledding at Heritage Park. Later that day there were more kids sledding on the hills near the clock tower. This spring, take a moment to watch a city ball game at one of the diamonds or come try disk golf.

Clinton has a total of 12 parks and land for 1 potential park in the future. We have close to 10 miles of trails. Public works does a great job taking care of parks but can always use more help.

Adopt-A-Park program was started about 10 years ago. This is an important effort that benefits us all. The more people watching out for our treasures the better. Please consider forming a group to "Adopt-A-Park" for 2023. It can be as simple as a few families, a neighborhood, a church or civic group, scout troop, sports team, coworkers etc. The main responsibility is keeping an eye open and letting the Parks Department know when there are broken items, especially sprinklers and lights, brown spots or dying trees/shrubs, and any graffiti. **SPACE HEATER SAFETY** Please follow the safety tips listed below when using space heaters in your home.

- Read the manufacturer's instruction manual before using any space heater.
- Check to make sure the heater bears the mark of a nationally recognized testing laboratory i.e. Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or Intertek (ETL).
- Keep space heaters at least **3 feet away** from any combustible materials, such as bedding, clothing, draperies, furniture, rugs, and decorations.
- Do not use space heaters in wet or damp areas unless the manufacturer's instructions indicate that it is intended for this use.
- Do not use space heaters in rooms where children are unsupervised.
- Portable heaters can cause sparking, do not use them where flammable liquids such as gasoline or kerosene are used or stored.
- Space heaters are meant to supply supplemental heat. Don't use them to warm bedding, cook food, dry clothing or thaw pipes.
- Plug portable space heaters directly into an appropriate outlet; do not use an extension cord. Unplug and safely store heaters when not in use.

Free tax preparation services are available through a program called **VITA**. To qualify, your income level needs to be at or below \$70,000. Only basic tax returns are processed. **IMPORTANT WINTER INFORMATION AND TIPS**

**Sidewalk Snow Removal**

Please remember that ALL Clinton City property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks along their property or business clear of snow and ice. Do not deposit snow in the street. Also, please keep bushes and trees near the sidewalks trimmed to provide a clear safe path for pedestrians.

**Winter Parking**

Winter Parking is in effect November 15th to March 15th. NO OVERNIGHT PARKING is allowed from midnight to 7:00 am no matter what the weather conditions are. Contact the Police Dept at 801-614-0800 with questions.

**Snow Plows**

Snow plows do their best to keep our roads clear and safe during snow storms. Please be patient and courteous to our drivers who work long hours, often on holidays and/or through the night clearing the snow from our streets. Major Roads and collector streets are plowed first followed by residential streets and cul-de-sacs.

**Winter Driving**

Please take the time to clear your windows of snow and ice before driving and drive slowly in inclement weather especially when approaching intersections & near schools.

**Vehicle Theft and Burglaries**

Please do not leave your vehicles unattended or unlocked while they are warming up.

**Removing snow from around hydrants is a crucial part of fire Safety!**

Be aware that snow-covered fire hydrants can delay fire services. If there is a fire hydrant near your home, please clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work in case of a fire (at least 3 feet). Clear the path from the hydrant to the street. Doing this can save responders precious seconds or minutes when responding to a fire.
