MAYOR'S MINUTE

Mark your calendars! Heritage Days will be June 9th & 10th, with tournaments throughout that week. I am excited to celebrate with all of you!

There will not be a carnival. However, the parade, car show, fireworks, golf tournament, pickleball and disc golf competitions, BBQ, movie night, music and entertainment will still happen.

Our number one goal is safety! Change is often difficult, especially when it feels like tradition is being broken. For many years Heritage Days has had a carnival. My kids have loved getting wristbands and going on all the rides. It definitely added lots of lights and sounds to Civic Center park. Over the years there has been an increase in incidents. Last year the police responded to approximately 20 disturbances. Juveniles lit fireworks off twice into the crowd, injuring several people. Fortunately, they were treated quickly by our fire and paramedics. The worst happened late Saturday night. Two groups of minors walked from the park and shortly thereafter started shooting at each other. Two individuals were hit and transported to the hospital with gunshot wounds. After further investigation it was determined that the individuals involved were not Clinton residents.

My hope is something similar doesn't ever happen in our city again. Two major changes have been made to Heritage Days to increase safety. First, the carnival contract was not renewed. Second, was to move the date earlier in the summer. The city council voted on both these changes. We anticipate this will make the celebration more safe and family friendly.

CLINTON CITY ORDINANCE UPDATE - ANIMAL CONTROL

Clinton City recently adopted the new Davis County Animal Care Ordinances. The County Animal Care management requested all the cities served by them to adopt this Ordinance Amendment as the new countywide standard in order to make enforcement easier and more consistent throughout the County. The new ordinance removes the City's previous separate language on cat licensing and the number of dogs allowed per household from two to three and solely adopts the County's code. However, City Code chapter 3.2 on Animal Waste will still be in effect since it augments that similar code in the County's Ordinance and can be enforced by the City if necessary.

A MESSAGE FROM DAVIS WEBER COUNTIES CANAL COMPANY REGARDING SECONDARY WATER

The past three water seasons have been challenging to say the least, with extreme/exceptional drought designations. The current water year is looking much better, but winter is not over yet. We hope that the snowpack continues to amass; we'll have a good runoff in the spring to fill reservoirs, and have good river flows throughout the summer. We ask that you plan to continue to use the secondary water wisely so that more water can get to the Great Salt Lake and we can have sufficient water left in storage in the river system for next year.

We continue to encourage efficient use of the water and to conserve where possible. Please adjust your watering based on the weather, referencing the State website (<http://www.conservewater.utah.gov>). We ask that you water no more than two times a week between April-June and September-October, and no more than 3 times a week in July and August (hotter months). If you're interested in getting a rebate for smart controllers and other water efficient fixtures, see <https://utahwatersavers.com/>.

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services and we are retrofitting existing services with meters. We are sending water use reports to those with meters in an effort to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources. Please contact us (meters@davisweber.org) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly.

We have recently completed a rate study and have raised the secondary water rates to meet the financial needs in order to operate and maintain the system and pay for secondary meters, capital projects, and make repairs when necessary. Thank you for your understanding. Check our website, www.davisweber.org, for further updates or restrictions. Remember to ensure your system is secure and ready for service by March 27th prior to us pressurizing the system. Often there is no need to water until May, especially in wet years.

Please note the rate increase will be effective March 1 and will be reflected in the Clinton City Utility bill that arrives in homes in April. The new rates are:

>1/3 - 1/2 acre	\$ 28.83 / month
>1/2 - 3/4 acre	\$ 33.75 / month
>3/4 - 1 acre	\$ 37.50 / month
> 1 - 1.25 acre	\$ 41.25 / month

However, consideration for school and other schedules will be reasonably accommodated. Applicants must be at least 16 years old, and must possess a valid driver's license. Applicants must also submit to, and pass a drug and alcohol test. ALL applicants MUST be willing to work well with others. Starting wage is \$12.00/hr. Performance increases will be given to those who exhibit a positive work ethic. Those with more experience may qualify for more.
