MAYOR'S MINUTE

Water and homes don't mix well. Flooding is the number one disaster risk in the state of Utah. Fortunately, Clinton City is in a great position geographically. We are not in close proximity to benches, valleys, rivers or lakes. On the FEMA Flood map, Clinton City shows as an area of minimal risk. There has not been a major flood in town in recent history.

As a city we are prepared! The Public Works department has been working hard making sure the city's storm drain system is in tip top shape. We have a free sandbag filling station for citizens located at the public works building during business hours. Elected officials and city staff have recently trained and created procedures in case of a disaster. As you drive through town, please call (801)614-0870, if you see any water bubbling up in the middle of the street or a large pool in the roadway.

Instead of widespread flooding, groundwater will be the largest threat to Clinton homes, especially those with basements. If you have a sump pump, please test it regularly. If not, the "sock test" is free and easy. Several times a week, walk around your basement walls with socks on. You will quickly know if you have a water problem. I recommend installing water alarms. Basic battery operated ones cost approximately \$5 a piece. If you want to spend more, there are wifi enabled ones that send alerts directly to your phone.

Please help the city by removing leaves and debris from storm drain grates. Make sure your rain gutters are cleaned and downspouts are flowing freely. Double check the outside perimeter of your home to make sure the ground slopes away from the foundation. Pump and downspout discharge points should be at least ten feet from the house.

My prayer is that everyone will be safe and their home stays dry. Please answer the call to serve if other cities need volunteers.

BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWAL

As of April 1, 2023, all businesses that have not renewed the business license for the 2023 business year will be considered to be operating a business without a business license. It is a Class B Misdemeanor to operate a business without a current business license, so if you are still operating a business please contact the Community Development Department as soon as possible to avoid a citation.

- Please trim your trees and shrubs in the park strips so that the street sweepers can sweep this summer. The City Code (25-16-5) states: "All shrubs and trees shall be pruned to permit plain view of regulatory (street and stop) and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or the sidewalk eight (8) feet." DISC GOLF

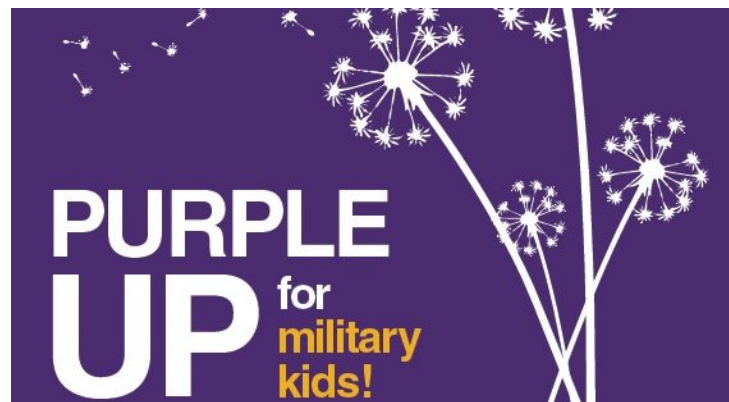
