Purple Up! Have you noticed purple ribbons around town or at the schools? As a city we were honored to participate and support, "Purple Up", the month of the military child. This designated time is a great time to recognize some of the military's most unsung heroes—the children. Purple is the color that symbolizes all branches of the military. Purple also represents sacrifice. On average a military child moves 3x more than their counterparts. This means that from kindergarten to graduation a child may have moved on average about 9 times. Wearing or displaying purple is a visible way for everyone to show support and thank all our military kids for their strength and sacrifices. The official flower of Purple Up is the dandelion. As its seeds are blown, taking route far and wide, the dandelion will plant its roots and blossom. This flower is believed to be a symbol of hope, growth and healing.

We are fortunate to live near Hill Air Force Base. It provides a lot of jobs for the nearby communities. Many of the individuals who work on base or for a related company have school age children. If a school has 20% or more of the student population whose guardian's employment is connected to base, the school is eligible for extra funding.

I encourage all Clinton residents that have employment that is in any way connected to the federal government, please reach out to your student's school to ensure your children are on the list.

I am deeply grateful for the sacrifice that all members of our military families give to our country. I've had the privilege of meeting many in our own community. Offices to be voted on in the 2023 Clinton City Municipal Election:

- Three (3) City Council Seats - 4 year terms each.

Declaration of Candidacy Forms or Nomination Petition must be filed in person with the City Recorder at 2267 N 1500 W Clinton, Utah between the hours of 8am and 5pm Monday thru Friday. The Candidate Filing Period is from Thursday June 1, 2023 to 5:00 pm on Wednesday June 7, 2023(UCA 10-3-301).

Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in (UCA 10-3-208).

The Primary Election if needed will be held on Tuesday, August 15, 2023. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2023. See the Clinton City website at www.clintoncity.com for more information.

NOTICE OF VACANT CLINTON CITY COUNCIL SEAT

The vacant Council seat has a short term which ends December 31, 2023. Because of the short period remaining on this term of office, if the appointed person to this vacant City Council Seat wishes to continue in that position past December 2023, he/she will need to run for City Council this 2023 election year. Sign-ups for the 2023 election run from June 1st to June 7th 2023.

Qualified residents who wish to be a candidate for this current vacant Council seat may pick up an application at City Hall 2267 N 1500 W or from the City website, www.clintoncity.com. Completed applications must be dropped off or emailed (dcluff@clintoncity.com) to the City Manager's office at City Hall before 5:00 pm on Tuesday May 9, 2023. The Mayor and City Council will hold interviews of qualified applicants at a Special Council Meeting on May 15th starting at 6:00 pm at City Hall. The City Council may appoint one of the applicants to the vacant City Council seat at the end of the interviews or at a subsequent Special Council meeting.

SECONDARY WATER UPDATE 2023

The snowpack is at record levels, water management measures are occurring to regulate reservoirs, minimize flooding, and to send water to the Great Salt Lake. Due to the snow and rain, the need for watering yards will be unnecessary since everything is saturated.

We ask that you plan to continue to use the secondary water wisely so that more water can get to the Great Salt Lake and we can have sufficient water left in storage in the river system for next year.

Please adjust your watering based on the weather and referencing the State website (<http://www.conservewater.utah.gov/>). We ask that you water no more than two times a week between May-June and September-October, and no more than 3 times a week in July and August (hotter months). If you are interested in getting a rebate for smart controllers and other water efficient fixtures, see <https://utahwatersavers.com/>.

Utah requires meters on all new secondary water services and we are retrofitting existing services with meters. We are sending water use reports to those with meters to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources. Please contact us at (meters@davisweber.org) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly. Check www.davisweber.org, for further updates or restrictions. NOTICE OF GARBAGE RATE FEE INCREASE - Effective

May 1, 2023 the fee for the first garbage can will be \$16.50 which is an increase of .40 and any additional cans will be \$13.00 which is an increase of .50. There will also be a \$25.00 delivery fee and a \$25.00 pick up fee for any additional cans.

CLINTON CITY PUBLIC WORKS

May 21-27, 2023 is National Public Works Week. We join in celebrating with Public Works Departments all over the world. Clinton City Public Works works hard to take care of all the assets, infrastructure and systems within the city, all things that you see and use that make this city great, and as much or more underground that you do not see.

In 2003, Presidential Policy Directive 8 (PPD-8) officially recognized Public Works as first responders. Public Works is often considered “the silent arm of public safety”... usually without fanfare. They are often the first on scene and the last to leave, “Ready and Resilient.” We take great pride in the city in having great parks, trails, lighting, roads, water, sewer, infrastructure and even the general appearance of it.

Clinton City Public Works consists of nine separate divisions and 23 full-time employees, sometimes doubling this number with part-time help in some seasons. All employees help where needed anywhere within Public Works divisions.

Public Works- We take care of administrative duties and calls that come in, city buildings, review plans, bid construction projects, and develop a budget for divisions. We maintain the connecting trails through the city (rail trail, 2050 N trail), scattered property throughout the city, and undeveloped city owned property. We do streetlight installation and repair, weed mowing and spraying, blue staking, GIS mapping, and anything else that does not fit into other divisions.

Streets- There are over 100 miles of roads that we maintain. We do road repair, replacement, treatments, crack seal, striping, curb, sidewalk, street signs; snow plowing, and traffic control. We conduct right of way and construction inspections, also issue right of way permits.

Parks- Our crews are busy maintaining about 120 acres in nine parks. This includes park trails, trees, turf, playgrounds, ball fields, and restrooms. We prep and maintain ball fields for various sports. We set up and take down the Heritage Days celebration, and put up and maintain flower pots, Christmas lights and decorations.

Cemetery- Our crews maintain 10 acres of cemetery, including digging graves, keeping records, and selling plots.

Motor Pool- Our fleet mechanics perform maintenance of city owned vehicles and equipment including police, fire, snow plows, mowers and more.

Water- We take great pride in delivering good, clean water in over 85 miles of pipe, 1 well, 3 storage tanks. We treat the water with chlorine and continually take samples and flush to ensure it is safe to drink. We repair leaks, monitor the pressure, read and service water meters, and constantly look for cross connections so the system is not contaminated. We have a great water system and are continually updating it.

Sewer- Our sewage is treated at North Davis Sewer District, but our city has a collection system of over 70 miles of pipe that we clean and maintain to get it there. We routinely clean and video pipe, along with inspecting every manhole.

Storm Drain- With over 65 miles of pipe, over 40 miles of land drain, detention basins, and numerous catch basins, we collect the storm water, send it to the wetlands and eventually into the Great Salt Lake. We work to be compliant in storm water regulations by teaching the public and preventing pollution and sediment from entering the storm water as much as possible. We monitor the water quality of the pond and control pollution from construction sites. Our storm water crews also take care of the street sweeping to prevent unwanted debris from entering the storm drain and to keep our streets clean.

Public Works Cont...

Storm Drain- With over 65 miles of pipe, over 40 miles of land drain, detention basins, and numerous catch basins, we collect the storm water, send it to the wetlands and eventually into the Great Salt Lake. We work to be compliant in storm water regulations by teaching the public and preventing pollution and sediment from entering the storm water as much as possible. We monitor the water quality of the pond and control pollution from construction sites. Our storm water crews also take care of the street sweeping to prevent unwanted debris from entering the storm drain and to keep our streets clean.

Solid Waste- Garbage pickup is contracted out to Robinson Waste. The city owns, delivers, and maintains the garbage cans. We have 4 community dump trailers that are scheduled out from spring to fall. Residents can sign up to have one parked near their home for a few days for their neighborhood to use. We also offer a spring and fall cleanup where residents can bring yard waste and other garbage to the Public Works facility for disposal. We work hard to keep our city clean and beautiful.

We take pride in Clinton City. Our task is very large, but we do all that we can to keep things running smoothly, looking good, and safe.

We want to thank public works for the great job they do for Clinton City and for answering the call of service whatever it may be.



NORTH DAVIS SEWER DISTRICT

ILLEGAL DISCHARGE OF STORMWATER/GROUND WATER & THE EFFECTS IT HAS ON SEWER LINES

2023 Snowfall has presented challenges to homeowners and the Sewer District. It's illegal for homeowners to drain excess water into the sewer system. Doing so can cause sewer backups into homes. The sewer pipes are not designed to have the capacity for stormwater/groundwater. If you have an illegal sump pump that is directing stormwater/groundwater into the sewer, please redirect it immediately.

NORTH DAVIS SEWER DISTRICT ORDINANCE STATES:

3-2-4 PROHIBITED CONNECTIONS - SANITARY SEWER

No person shall cause to be discharged or make a connection which would allow any storm water, surface drainage, groundwater, roof runoff, cooling water, garage drainage, outside stairwell drainage, patio drainage, groundwater sump pump discharges or other water to be discharged into any sanitary sewer. No person shall cause any of the above-mentioned waters to be mixed with that person's sewage in order to dilute said sewage.

3-2-5 PROHIBITED DISCHARGE

Storm water, surface drainage, subsurface drainage, groundwater, roof runoff, cooling water or unpolluted water shall not be admitted to and/or use sanitary sewers.
