Have you heard about Clinton's "Club 55"? If you are 55 or older, please join us! Lunch is provided for a \$5 donation if you are able, or for free, at the community room connected to the recreation building. It is held on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at noon. I've enjoyed helping serve meals during this event. One of my highlights as Mayor has been interacting and getting to know many of our long-time residents and seniors. Two prior mayors and a couple prior council members regularly attend. I am always impressed with everyone's admiration for God and Country. Lunch is catered by local businesses, and we end with a few rounds of bingo and prizes. I'm looking forward to seeing you there.

We are excited to announce this year's 911 Day of Service projects:

1. Wed, Sept 6th—**Clinton City Youth Service Night** for all youth ages 11-18 beginning at 5 p.m. at the Clinton Civic Park (1850 West 2300 North). Bring shovels, rakes, gloves, and a water bottle to help beautify the park and prepare for Saturday's projects. Dinner and games will be provided after the service project.
2. Sat, Sept 9th—**Clinton City Community Flag Raising** for all Clinton residents and families at Veterans Park (1000 West 1800 North) at 8 a.m.
3. Sat, Sept 9th—**Clinton City Parks Service Projects** will begin following the flag ceremony. There are various opportunities for families to help beautify many of our parks in Clinton City. Bring shovels, rakes, wheelbarrows, and gloves. We will be placing gravel in parkstrips, spreading mulch, planting trees, painting, pulling weeds, and more.
4. Mon, Aug 14th through Wed, Sept 6th, we will be collecting items for the Davis Education Foundation Teen Centers located in our high schools. A collection box will be inside the Clinton City Recreation Dept at 1651 W 2300 N. Items needed: Full-size shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, lotion, hand sanitizer, toothpaste, soap, and body wash. Other items needed include single toothbrushes, washcloths, laundry detergent, dryer sheets, feminine products, and boys and girls underwear for children (K to 6th grade). Donations will also be accepted at the Clinton Civic Park Bowery on Wed, Sept 6th from 5-7 p.m.

At 10 am on August 10, 2023 a test message will go out to citizens of Clinton by text, phone, voicemail and/or email.

If you are not currently registered, now would be a good time to sign up for the Notification System. To do so, click on the

Red Phone  or go to www.clintoncity.com and click on the **Red Phone** there. By registering, you can specify how you will receive notifications and you can keep your profile updated with accurate contact information to ensure you are notified of important information or of an emergency.

To recreate your password click on this link <https://public.alertsense.com/SignUp/?RegionId=1689> or retype it in your browser, choose login, then put your email address in and choose the reset password option, this will cause the system to send you a password reset link. An email is required; if you do not have an email address please contact Lisa at 801-614-0700.

Please note that our Emergency Notification System is automatically and regularly updated through our Utility Billing system. If your information on file is not accurate, and you have not registered on our website, you may **NOT** receive the EMERGENCY NOTICES. Please call our Utilities Department at 801-614-0700 to update your billing contact information.

If you are an owner of a rental property, please **ENCOURAGE** your renters to register for notifications on our website, as this is the only way they will receive notifications or alerts. Thank you!

**2023 CLINTON CITY
MUNICIPAL ELECTION INFORMATION**

In 2023 Clinton City will hold a General Election Only on November 21, 2023.

Offices to be voted on: Three (3) Council Member Seats 4-year term each - Jan 1, 2024 – Dec 31, 2027

The Clinton City Municipal Election will be conducted as Vote by Mail in coordination with the Davis County Clerk/Auditor. For information on Vote by Mail & Voter Registration ([click here](#)). For those who wish to vote early, ballots can be dropped off in a secure drop box in the Recreation Department parking lot 1651 W 2300 N prior to the election. All drop off ballot boxes are open whether the city is having an election or not. Voters can deposit ballots in the drop boxes anytime up until 8 pm on Election Day. If voters put their ballot in the mail, it must be postmarked on or before Mon, Nov 20, 2023 to be counted. A polling location will be available at Clinton City Recreation on Nov 21, 2023 for the General Election from 7 am to 8pm to vote in person.
