MAYOR'S MINUTE

What does Garth Brooks and Eminem have in common? It's quite the paradox, but they are two of my favorite music artists. I know some might not like rap music but how can you not like greatness? Eminem is the best selling rapper of all time! If I can't convince you to like rap then hopefully I can sway you to vote for a RAP tax. Please stay with me for anyone who tuned out when they heard the word rap or tax.

RAP is short for Recreation, Arts and Parks. Sometimes it's also referred to as RAPT. The added T is for Trails. Implementing a local sales tax to fund these items can be highly beneficial for a community. This is something new to Clinton but not to Davis County. The majority of cities in the county have instituted this already. In fact, Clearfield has had theirs in place for a decade.

For every \$10 spent in Clinton, 1 penny would be set aside to be used only towards recreation, arts, parks and trails. This is equivalent to one tenth of one percent written as .1%. My favorite part of this proposal is that a RAP sales tax is paid by all who make purchases in the city. The funding burden is spread widely across the community. I love our neighboring cities. I am thankful they come to Clinton often to shop. I'm a big fan of having them leave a few cents for us. It's like they are giving Clinton a tip.

It is estimated that the RAP tax would generate approximately \$300,000 annually. That is the same revenue as a 10% increase in the city's portion of property taxes. If we had instituted this when Clearfield originally did we would have collected over 2 million dollars with the majority coming from non residents.

Here are a few other reasons why this should be supported. Better recreation, arts, parks and trails improve our quality of life. It promotes healthy lifestyles. It boosts the local economy when tournaments and groups visit to use our facilities. It provides more family friendly activities. It also helps expand access by discounting fees, offering free programs, and improving facilities.

Your ballot will arrive in the mail close to Nov 1st. Please VOTE YES on Proposition #10. It will be the last item on the ballot.

Offices to be voted on: Three (3) Council Member Seats 4-year terms each - Jan 1, 2024 – Dec 31, 2027

The election will be conducted as Vote by Mail in coordination with the Davis County Clerk/Auditor. For information on Vote by Mail & Voter Registration ([click here](#)). For those who wish to vote early, ballots can be dropped off in a secure drop box in the Recreation Dept parking lot 1651 W 2300 N prior to the election. Voters can deposit ballots in the drop boxes up until 8 pm on Election Day. If voters mail ballots, they must be postmarked on or before Mon, Nov 20, 2023 to be counted. A polling location will be available at Clinton City Recreation 1651 W 2300 N on Nov 21, 2023 from 7 am to 8pm to vote in person.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS Ordinance 16-7-19 will go into effect November 15 through March 15. No on street parking including vehicles or trailers is allowed from 12 am to 7 am regardless of the weather. This will allow our snow plows to maintain the roads efficiently, especially in the event of a surprise storm.
