### MAYOR'S MINUTE

How do you eat an elephant? IYKYK. If you haven't heard that one, you will have to hunt for the answer below. I hope to someday meet the person who designs Garff Automotive's clever billboards. Like the billboards on I-15, as elected officials, "We Hear You". The city council and I have heard your frustrations. We regularly hear from citizens that they want a better image for the city. They request that our code be enforced. Unfortunately, there are two major reasons why that has been hard to accomplish.

The first reason is that our code was written that infractions, other than parking, become criminal. Any non-compliance is required to be dealt with through our court. It takes lots of time and resources to have a prosecutor and judge handle small code items. It doesn't make sense to issue an arrest warrant or send someone to jail over weeds.

The second reason is that Clinton has not had a code enforcement position in over a decade. The last person working for the city in such a role was in 2012. Nuisances till now have been handled by various city departments. Police were dealing with unregistered vehicles and parking issues. Fire was in charge of weeds. Public works took care of overgrown trees in roads and sidewalks.

Multiple solutions are in the works. We have funds set aside in the budget and are searching to hire a part time compliance person. The position will bring continuity and equality to the process. This individual will work directly with Community Development, freeing up police and fire to focus on what they do best. Staff is working to select software which will streamline every step. It will allow for online reporting, photo uploads, reminders and case closure. They are also putting together recommendations that will change the code from criminal to civil. This means a monetary amount may be assessed after a specific period of time in which an item has not been brought into compliance. It will also allow for the city to abate issues. I hope the city council will approve these changes in the near future.

The goal is to keep our city safe, beautiful and clean. Instead of being reactive let's be proactive. Safety is paramount. Well-maintained neighborhoods with properties in good repair attract great residents and businesses. We each have a shared responsibility for the overall look and feel of our town.

In a recent work session we leaned into the fun of March Madness by making brackets with the city's "sweet sixteen" most common code complaints. We then voted on which item would make it to the next round. The two finalists were Weeds and Parking. Weeds took the championship!

Please be patient. We can't waive a magic wand and fix everything at once, but rest assured we are listening to your feedback and actively taking steps toward necessary changes. By working together we will chip away little by little, bite by bite. Because that is how you would eat an elephant as large as code enforcement.

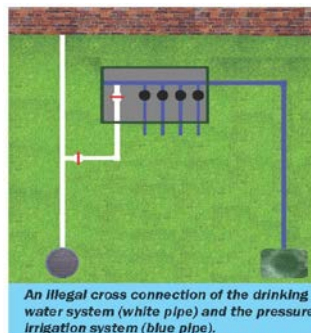

Beginning on Monday, April 1, 2024, Clinton City and Clearfield City will begin construction on 800 North between 1000 West and 450 West. Secondary Water will be available approximately April 15. Please get your system ready by making sure your gates and lines are closed by April 1, while lines are being pressurized to prevent flooding.

### AVOID CROSS CONNECTIONS

A cross connection is any actual or potential connection between the water you want to drink and other sources of undesirable substances (e.g., used water, industrial fluids, etc.) to enter your drinking water. Through our cross-connection control program we provide oversight and monitor connections to our system to alleviate the possibility of water back-flowing

from a consumer, either residential or commercial, into our distribution system. You can do your part by monitoring your own water use and connections within your home or business.

The annual Shred Day Event for Clinton City residents will be held again this year on Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 am until noon. The event will be held in the lower parking lot to the west of the Justice Court entrance. Paper records with paper file folders are acceptable. Example items not accepted are biohazard waste, batteries, trash, pill bottles, hard drives, etc. Call the City Treasurer's Office at 801-614-0700 for any questions.
