MAYOR'S MINUTE

Where you from? "Merica, I'm a local." Where in America? "Utah, I'm a local." Whereabouts? "Davis County, I'm a local." What city? "Clinton, I'm a local." I love Clinton, what street? "Near the road construction, I'm a local." Unfortunately, none of these answers are correct when passing the big signs that say ROAD CLOSED - LOCAL TRAFFIC ONLY.

Many of you already know Clinton has two roads that are state owned. 1800 North and 2000 West are property of UDOT. Both roads are going to be expanded to five lanes which means traffic cones and road closures for the next several years. The bad news is 2000 West funding and expansion ends near Lowes and will neck back down to three lanes. Translation- the traffic jam will only be moved a little north. Please encourage anyone you know at UDOT and all our representatives to fast track and fund the expansion from Lowes to at least 5600 South or better yet to Midland.

On average, nearly a thousand people are killed each year in work zone crashes in the United States. According to the Governors Highway Safety Association, all states have laws that increase the penalties for speeding or committing other traffic violations while in a construction work zone.

Tips for driving safely in work zones.

1. Expect the unexpected - Traffic lanes may be changed, and people may be working on or near the road.
2. Slow down - Speeding is one of the major causes of work zone crashes.
3. Don't tailgate - Keep a safe distance between you and the car ahead of you. (Jack Stanger)
4. Keep your distance - Keep a safe distance between your vehicle and the construction workers and their equipment.
5. Pay attention to the signs - Observe the posted signs until you see the one that says you've left the work zone.
6. Obey road crew flaggers - A flagger has the same authority as a regulatory sign, so you can be cited for disobeying directions.
7. Stay alert and minimize distractions - Dedicate your full attention to the roadway and avoid changing radio stations or using cell phones while driving. (Jack Stanger)
8. Be patient and stay calm -- The work zone crew members are working to improve the road and make your future drive better!

One major reason for "local traffic only" closures is that crews often need to occupy lanes or the entire road to conduct repairs, repaving, or infrastructure improvements. Attempting to drive through these areas puts both yourself and workers at risk of a devastating accident.

In Clinton, driving on a road closed to thru traffic is illegal and may result in an expensive ticket or other penalties. Law enforcement understandably takes these violations seriously, as they compromise safety.

"I'm a local" or "local traffic only" is defined as someone not able to access their destination by any other detour. For everyone else, please plan an alternate route rather than attempting to circumvent road closures, even on weekends. Stay safe Clinton!
