MAYOR'S MINUTE

Where were you? Besides Slim Shady, country music is my favorite. Alan Jackson wrote an amazing song titled "Where Were You (When the World Stopped Turning)." His song refers back to the emotions and reactions many were experiencing after the worst terrorist attack in US history. On the morning of September 11, 2001, four planes were hijacked. The twin towers in New York were both struck, causing them to collapse. The Pentagon was also hit, and the last plane crashed in a field approximately twenty minutes from its intended target, the White House or Capitol. If you are over twenty-five, you remember that morning well.

I remember waking up to voicemails saying there had been a terrorist attack. Connie and I were recently married, and we didn't have a TV. We drove over to a relative's house and watched the devastating events unfold. I felt so sad for the nearly 3,000 people who died and the more than 6,000 injured.

"Did you burst out with pride for the red, white, and blue and the heroes who died just doin' what they do?" I will always remember seeing the flag raised at Ground Zero on top of the rubble pile. George Bush said to the nation that night, "Terrorist attacks can shake the foundations of our biggest buildings, but they cannot touch the foundation of America. These acts shattered steel, but they cannot dent the steel of American resolve." One other meaningful moment to me was when a tattered flag was carried into the stadium for the SLC Olympics. That flag, torn and missing stars, was found during cleanup and thought to have been flying the morning of the attacks.

If you are ever near New York City, please take the time to visit the 9/11 Memorial Museum. It is one of the most powerful and moving places I have visited. You will be forever changed from the experience. If you don't have travel plans, the next best is to attend the Major Brent Taylor Foundation's 9/11 Project. It is an amazing display of what transpired. This year, it will be open from 9am to 9pm, September 11-14th, in Cache Valley. It's free admission and well worth the drive.

As the anniversary approaches, please take a moment to remember the fallen and to serve others. I have been touched watching our citizens come out in years past to serve together. This year, on Wednesday, September 11th, there is a city-wide youth service project and a patriotic ceremony. For any youth who would like to participate in the 9/11 day of service, please come to one of these three locations at 6 PM: Heritage Park, Clinton Cemetery, or the Rail Trail at 1800 N and 1000 W across from Clinton Elementary. A patriotic ceremony and flag retirement will be held at the fire station at 7:30 pm. Just as the nation came together after 9/11, we can continue that spirit of unity and strength each and every year. Please take time to share with your kids or grandkids "where were you" that day. Help them understand your love for America! "Faith, hope, and love are some good things He gave us, and the greatest is love." #NeverForget

RAP TAX COMMITTEE

In the November 2023 General Election, Clinton City voters approved the implementation of 0.1% sales and use tax, known as the Recreation, Arts and Parks Tax (RAP) to fund park improvements, recreational improvements and cultural facilities and organization within the City.

To support the general welfare of the City, promote the fiscal responsibility and protect the use and integrity of the funds collected from this tax and for the benefit of the public, the City Council has voted to establish a RAP Tax Committee.

This new committee will consist of three members with a focus on Parks, three members with a focus on Recreation, and three members with a focus on Arts. Term appointments are for three years, however initial appointments to the committee may be appointed to terms less than three (3) years to provide for staggered terms. They will meet quarterly (or as often as needed) to discuss ideas and information they want to share with the City Council.

Applications for this committee are currently being accepted through September 15, 2024. Go to the City's website ([follow this link](#)) or, from the website, follow the link under News and Announcements on the front page or go to employment opportunities and click on the RAP Tax Committee Member, to fill out an application. The applicants will be chosen by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council and will be appointed by the Mayor at the September 24th City Council meeting.

AIR FORCE OFFERS NEW AIR SAMPLING OPTION TO RESIDENTS & BUSINESSES

The Air Force is offering free indoor air testing to residents and businesses that are over areas of groundwater contamination from Hill Air Force Base.



New to the program is the Resident-Placed Sampling option, which allows residents to place the sampling device without having a sampling technician enter the home. Sampling equipment and detailed instructions will be provided at the door.



Potentially harmful chemical vapors from the groundwater could be entering homes or workplaces. Having a test done is the only way to know if vapors are entering your building. A letter with details about the testing will be mailed to residents/businesses in affected areas in September.

If you receive a letter, testing is needed. If your home has been tested previously and you receive the letter, additional testing is needed. If you do not receive a letter, your home or business does not require testing and is not in the affected area.



All testing is free and requires placement of a pencil-size device in the home for 24 to 26 days. If vapors are found, any mitigation efforts to prevent vapors from entering your building will also be free. Testing will run from October 2024 to March 2025.
