WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter parking will go into effect November 15 through March 15. No on street parking including vehicles or trailers is allowed from 12 am to 7 am regardless of the weather. This will allow our snowplows to maintain the roads efficiently, especially in the event of a surprise storm. You may contact the police department at 801-614-0800 to make special arrangements on a short-term basis.

Also, please trim all shrubs and trees to permit plain view of regulatory and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or sidewalk eight (8) feet." This will help snowplows properly maintain our streets this winter. Call 801-614-0870 with questions.

Thanksgiving is the leading day of the year for home fires involving cooking equipment. Safety in the kitchen is important especially when there are a lot of activity and people at home. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) suggests the following safety measures: Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking; stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently; keep children at least 3 feet away from the stove and hot liquids; keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags; keep knives out of the reach of children; keep electric cords out of the reach of children; keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children; never leave children alone in a room with a lit candle; make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

These are helpful tips to use during the holidays and all year.
