MAYOR'S MINUTE

Ladies and Gentlemen, may I introduce to you Connie Valentine and Dan Heiner. They are extraordinary volunteers. Both these individuals have been serving Clinton City for over 15 years. In fact, they are founding members of Clinton's CERT program. If you are not familiar with CERT please read on. Clinton currently has approximately 100 CERT members. This past city council meeting we recognized our newest members. Welcome Scott Doutre, Carter Dennis, and Courtney Kendricks to the team.

In times of disaster or emergency, every second counts — and that is where our local Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers come in. These trained individuals are an essential part of our city's emergency preparedness. They offer vital support when professional first responders may be overwhelmed.

CERT is a national program supported by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) that educates volunteers about disaster preparedness. Through hands-on training, volunteers learn basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. The program empowers everyday citizens to take an active role in helping themselves, their families, and their neighbors during emergencies. In our city, CERT volunteers work closely with the fire and police departments. They mobilize during emergencies like floods, wildfires, power outages, or earthquakes. They provide critical assistance including crowd control, damage assessment, shelter support, and first aid. They also help with distributing supplies and checking on vulnerable community members, such as seniors or those with disabilities.

One of the greatest benefits of having an active CERT program is the added layer of community resilience it brings. By bridging the gap between emergency services and residents, CERT helps ensure that more people receive help faster when it is needed most. Their efforts not only save lives but also reduce the strain on first responders, allowing them to focus on the most critical situations.

Heritage Days is a little over a month away! Please take time to shake hands and say thank you to our CERT volunteers. They are instrumental in making large community events safe. You can find them dotted along road closures for the parade and throughout the festivities. They are easy to spot dressed in a neon safety vest and donning white cap. CERT members are the calm, trained hands ready to help when chaos strikes and best of all they are your neighbors. Be part of the solution! CERT training is free and open to residents who want to make a difference.
