The League of Women Voters of Davis County (a non-partisan organization) will host a [Meet the Candidate forum](#) on Wed, Oct 8 for the Mayor and City Council Election. The forum will be held at city offices, 2267 N 1500 W, Clinton in the Council Chambers.

The format will be an in-person Meet & Greet at 6:30 pm followed by a moderated panel at 7 pm streamed and recorded.

Each candidate will begin with a 2-minute introduction after which the moderator will ask 5 or 6 specific questions. Each candidate will answer the same question in rotating order concluding with a 1-minute summary from each candidate. Visit www.lwdavis.org for more information.

The Clinton City Municipal Election will be conducted as Vote by Mail in coordination with the Davis County Clerk/Auditor. For information on Vote by Mail & Voter Registration [\(click here\)](#). For those who wish to vote early, ballots can be dropped off in a secure drop box in the Recreation Department parking lot 1651 W 2300 N prior to the election. Voters can deposit ballots in the drop boxes up until 8 pm on Election Day. If voters mail ballots, they must be delivered on or before Tues. Nov 4, 2025 at 8 pm to be counted. A polling location will be available at Clinton City Recreation on Nov 4, 2025 from 7 am to 8pm to vote in person.

STORM WATER

Clean wetlands and healthy streams are important to Clinton City. The water from parking lots, driveways, and streets flow into the storm drain which goes untreated into the streams, wetlands, and eventually enters the Great Salt Lake. Pollution entering the storm drain makes the waterways unsafe for people and wildlife.

Please only drain a pool or spa when chlorine levels are very low, (less than 0.019 mg/l). Re-use the water for landscaped areas whenever possible; avoid allowing the water to drain onto neighboring properties. Otherwise, drain to the sanitary sewer system in coordination with the North Davis Sewer District 801-825-0712. Avoid copper-based algaecides such as copper sulfate; even a lower concentration can be a mild irritant to humans and is fatal to fish! Thank you!

HILL AFB OFFERS FREE INDOOR AIR SAMPLING

The U.S. Air Force is offering free indoor air sampling to homes and businesses near areas of groundwater contamination from historic activities at Hill Air Force Base.

If you receive a postcard from the Air Force, your location is eligible, and participation is strongly encouraged by the Air Force, EPA, and Utah DEQ.

Testing is conducted with a 26-day passive, pencil-sized device (shown here), offered from Oct 2024 to March 2026. All testing and any necessary mitigation is paid for by the Air Force.



Eligible locations can now schedule sampling appointments online (URL on postcard), or request sampling by contacting the project manager listed below. City drinking water is safe and is not affected.

Vouchers can be picked up at City Hall 2267 N 1500 W in the Utility Department. The vouchers are redeemable at Davis Landfill located at 1997 E 3500 N.

Weekly Green Waste Drop Off- NO GRASS OR LEAVES. Residents may bring, cuttings from plants, bushes, or tree branches up to a maximum of 8" in diameter to the Public Works yard

Delivery & Unloading

The delivery and unloading of branches will not be provided by Clinton City.

Please maintain all trees and shrubs in the park strip. Keep them trimmed up so they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or the sidewalk eight (8) feet." Please give Public Works a call with any questions or concerns at 801-614-0870, M-F 7am-3 pm. Thank You!

The Utah Department of Transportation's 1800 North Improved Mobility project started in March 2025, and crews have been busy relocating utility lines along 1800 North and working on the new bridge structure on I-15. Side street closures along 1800 North will continue, and drivers should follow on-the-ground signage for detour routes.

Our team continues to coordinate with local schools ensuring safe walking routes for students are maintained along with scheduling school assemblies on safety near the work zone. As a reminder, pedestrians and cyclists should stay out of the work zone and follow posted detour signs.

Big changes are on tap this fall and winter! Crews are starting to work on the frontage roads between 300 West and 810 West and once these roads are built, traffic will be shifted to allow crews to start working on the new bridge over the railroad crossing.

Coming spring 2026, northbound I-15 will be shifted to the new alignment east of the current I-15 while crews work on the southbound lanes.

This project is scheduled to be completed in fall 2027.
