It's with a heavy heart that I share, Councilmember Austin Gray will be moving from Clinton and resigning from the city council. His dedication, thoughtful approach, and example of how to "disagree better" has left a lasting mark. I have always been impressed with his ability to study the issues and debate his opinion in a very professional and statesman-like way. Austin, thank you for your service, you will be missed!

Applicants will be interviewed by the City Council at a future date, after which, one individual will be appointed to fulfill his term.

It's no secret that politics can get ugly. Too often, disagreements turn into personal attacks, and strong opinions drown out respectful conversation. But at the heart of good government, whether at the national level or right here in Clinton, is the ability to listen, understand, and work together, even when we view things differently.

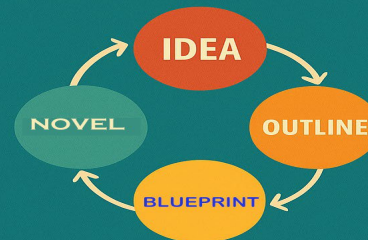

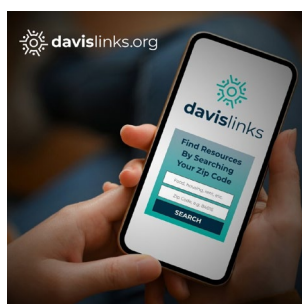
WATER CROSS CONNECTIONS

Please do not connect the pressure irrigation system (automatic sprinklers) to the culinary (drinking) water supply system. Secondary and Culinary water systems are two completely separate piping systems, connecting the two is illegal and dangerous to the culinary water distribution system throughout the City. This kind of cross connection is a Class C Misdemeanor and will also result in an immediate turn off of culinary water. If you feel you must provide some water to your landscape after the secondary water is turned off, use a hose connected to your house's outdoor culinary water faucet.

Warning! An illegal cross-connection is extremely dangerous! Never connect the drinking water piping to the secondary piping. The pressure in the secondary water system is higher than the pressure in the drinking water system and the secondary water will be forced into the drinking water line.
