MAYOR'S MINUTE

What an amazing World Series! Go Dodgers, sorry I couldn't root for Canada. I love baseball. My dad was a Yankee fan, and I followed in his footsteps. Like most, my dream as a kid was to be a professional baseball player. I wanted to be like Reggie Jackson, aka "Mr. October" or Don Mattingly. Both of these players were league MVPs. Reggie won five World Series and became a Hall of Famer.

I'd like to introduce to you Clinton's "Mr. October" who comes in clutch and is always hitting bombers. Meet Bryce Wilcox, our city engineer. Like Reggie, he's been playing in the majors for over 20 years. His first project with Clinton started in 1999, working on our big water tanks. In 2002, Clinton signed him to play for us. When it comes to knowing everything about the city, he is definitely our MVP.

Some cities have an in-house staff engineer. However, we have won many pennants working with Bryce and his extensive bullpen at J.U.B. Engineers, including their grant writing group. Combined with city staff and the city's leadership, this has proven to be a World Series winning team over and over!

Grants bring more money into our city and help keep property taxes low. These competitive state and federal funds allow Clinton to take on big projects, like improving streets, upgrading water and sewer systems, expanding trails, and enhancing parks; that might otherwise take decades to afford. They're a true partnership between local leadership, state and federal programs, and you, our residents. Each grant takes a lot of work and collaboration, but the payoff is worth it: stronger infrastructure, a growing economy, and a better quality of life for everyone.

Ohtani makes \$70 million per year, but Clinton, through teamwork and great relationships, has secured over \$58 million in grants since 2002. Some of our recent homers have been our \$250k general plan, \$6 million for pedestrian bridge over 2000 N between Lowes and Discount Tire, \$7.3 million for a future roundabout street project, \$1.7 million for road realignment on 2300 near Cranefield. If the government would ever open up, by working with Congressman Blake Moore, Clinton is being considered for a \$5 million sewer infrastructure grant.

Bryce, thank you for helping Clinton with many wins over the past couple of decades. I hope you're around for many years, but when you do retire, I want to be there to congratulate you and watch you be entered into Clinton City's Hall of Fame!

As your mayor, I take pride in knowing that our team is always working hard to win grants. Every grant we earn is another step toward a stronger, safer, and more connected community. We'll continue to pursue every opportunity available to make sure our residents get the most value for every dollar spent. Smart investments today mean a better Clinton tomorrow!
