MAYOR'S MINUTE

Please join me in congratulating and welcoming the following individuals: Jennifer Christensen, recently appointed to serve two years on the city council. Starting Jan 1, Christopher Danson and Adam Larsen will be the new city council members, and Marie Dougherty the mayor.

As I wrap up my fourth year as your mayor, this will be my last Mayor Minute. I want to express my sincere gratitude for the trust and support you have given me. Serving you and this community has truly been one of the greatest honors of my life. Being an Eagle Scout, my goal has always been to leave things better than I found them. Looking back at what we have accomplished together, I am proud to say that is exactly what has happened in Clinton.

One of the greatest strengths of our city today is the new team behind it. Over the past four years, we have brought in outstanding leadership and staff who are committed to transparency, professionalism, and service. Our new city manager is a superstar! We have added a HR specialist, finance director, code enforcer, and even a part time communications person. Our legal team is upgraded, and they are top notch. These changes have helped instill a new energy and culture at City Hall. Combined, their expertise has raised the bar for how we operate as a city and provided many opportunities to be more efficient with your tax dollars.

Public safety has been a top priority, and we have made significant gains. For the first time in Clinton's history, we now have one police officer per 1,000 residents. We welcomed a new fire chief and assistant chief. We added one paramedic and two full-time firefighters, improving response times and reducing overtime burdens. These investments ensure our community remains safe, well-prepared, and supported around the clock.

We have also taken bold steps to plan for the future. We secured a \$250,000 grant to update our General Plan and create three small-area plans. We annexed new land and set the foundation to add another 150+ acres to position Clinton for responsible, well-managed expansion. On the housing front, we updated zoning to allow a broader range of options, including small lot single family homes mixed with townhomes. These additions will help our heroes (military, police, fire, healthcare, teachers) find an attainable place to call home right here in Clinton.

Financial stewardship and fairness remain central to our work. We implemented rental dwelling license fees. Water rates were reformed to a more equitable, usage-based tiered system. This helps encourage conservation while keeping rates fair for widows and small households.

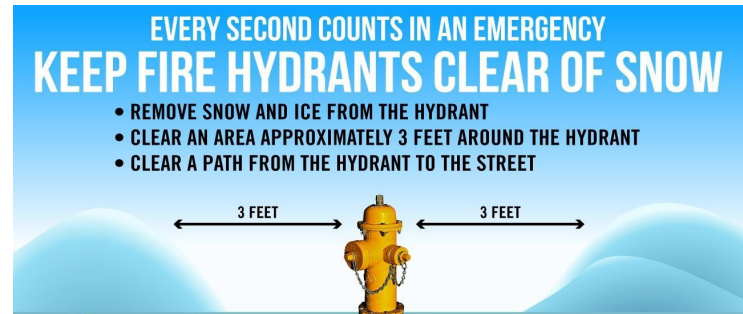
I am most proud that Clinton is one of the first handful of cities in the state of Utah to have a term limit ordinance for elected and appointed officials. This is one policy point that the majority of voters agree is important for the government. It brings fresh perspectives and fosters collaboration and teamwork.

Our local economy grew a ton. This is important and will help keep property taxes lower. We welcomed Fat Cats, Tractor Supply, Sherwin Williams, Holiday Oil, Dutch Bros, Chipotle, Fizz, Wedgies, Nothing Bundt Cake and the list goes on and on. If you haven't noticed Home Depot has broken ground!

As our community continues to grow, my prayer is that our love for Clinton will grow too. That each one of us will pick up that piece of trash, help a neighbor, volunteer when possible, shop local, etc. to make our city better day after day. I am thankful for FatCats bringing back the large flag. I am proud to live in Clinton, Utah, and the USA! God bless us all.

COMMUNITY RENTAL ROOM RESERVATIONS

Rental room reservations for 2026 will open on January 2nd. The cost for Clinton Residents is \$40/hr., with a \$250 refundable security deposit. All fees are due at the time of reservation. The room may be reserved on any day of the week, excluding State/Federal Holidays, between the hours of 8 a.m. – 10 p.m. Call (801) 614-0780 for availability. Reservations are only available in person at the Recreation Office.

PARK BOWERY RESERVATIONS

Park Bowery reservations for 2026 will open on January 2nd. The cost to reserve a bowery for Clinton Residents is \$30 per 5-hour time block, with a \$50 refundable security deposit. All fees are due at the time of reservation. Bowery's may be reserved between 04/15/2026-10/15/2026 and are available at Civic Center Park, Heritage Park, Meadows Park, Veteran's Park, and West Clinton Park. Reservations may be made through our website or at the Recreation.

UDOT ANNOUNCES BIG CHANGES ALONG 1800 NORTH!

Crews have finished installing the south frontage road between 810 W and 300 W and are in the process of shifting traffic so the bridge over the railroad tracks can be built. This traffic pattern will remain until traffic is shifted onto the bridge over the tracks in May/June 2026.

Crews are working farther west along 1800 N with traffic shifted to the center of the road between 1000 W and 1900 W. This will allow crews to work on utilities (water, storm drain, etc.) on both sides of the street.

Coming spring 2026, northbound I-15 traffic will move onto the new lanes east of the current I-15, currently being constructed on land previously owned by Hill Air Force Base, while crews work on the southbound lanes.
