### ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The 2015 Clinton City Road Projects with the exception of landscape and concrete work on 3000 W between 1800 N and the Roy border are complete.

The West Point project on 3000 W remains under construction. The 800 North intersection will be closed to all traffic while the pavement is completed. The opening date for 800 North will be announced after paving and finishing work is completed. Please plan accordingly and thank you for your patience on this project.

Utility improvements are continuing to the north of 1050 North. Work in this area will be dependent on the weather, but the asphalt roadway will not be removed and replaced until spring.

### Roundabouts

Roundabouts provide safer and more efficient traffic flow than standard intersections. They keep traffic moving one-way in a counterclockwise direction with fewer conflict points which allows traffic to flow smoothly.



### Steps for Driving a Roundabout

1. Slow down. Obey traffic signs
2. Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists.
3. Yield to traffic on your left already in the roundabout.
4. Enter the roundabout when there is a safe gap in traffic.
5. Keep your speed low within the roundabout.
6. As you approach your exit, turn on your right turn signal.

Please remember the City Ordinance states that ALL Clinton City property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks along their property or business clear of snow and ice and prohibits anyone from depositing snow into public roads.

Winter Parking restrictions are effect Nov 15 to Mar 15. NO OVERNIGHT PARKING is allowed from midnight to 7 am no matter what the snow conditions are. Call 801-614-0800 with questions.

PLANNING SOME HOME IMPROVEMENTS IN THE NEW YEAR?  
PLEASE GET A BUILDING PERMIT

It is important to obtain a building permit when doing home improvements such as finishing a basement, home additions, home remodels, installing a new furnace, air conditioner or water heater etc.

The city is a source of up-to-date information. The goal of the Community Development Department is to provide homeowners with handouts, plan review and other information which will help ensure that the electrical, plumbing, mechanical and framing techniques used are compliant with the latest safety and model code requirements adopted by the State of Utah.

The building inspectors goal is to provide a second set of eyes to ensure that the work done is both safe and code compliant. Obtaining a permit also protects the homeowner when having to make an insurance claim regarding any addition or remodel to their home. Not obtaining a building permit could provide your insurance company with justification to deny a claim on damage to that portion of your home.

If you need the help of a contractor with your home project, make sure they are licensed with the State of Utah and that they have obtained a permit. Whether it's pouring cement, finishing your basement or putting an addition on your home, it is important to do your homework and ensure that the contractor you choose is capable, professional and licensed in the line of work you need performed. Remember, if the deal seems "Too Good To Be True?" it probably is. So, when in doubt, check them out! The State of Utah has a web-site [www.dopl.utah.gov](http://www.dopl.utah.gov) you can use to verify this information.

So, when you're ready to start your home improvement project, call or stop in at the Community Development desk at city hall so we can assist you in completing your project in a safe and efficient manner.

## CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY TIPS

Christmas time is here and "tis the season to be jolly"; tis also the season many of us go out and buy natural Christmas trees. Always pick a tree that is fresh and not showing signs of dryness or leaking sap.

Failure to keep a Christmas tree moist and packing it full of lights and decorations increases the dangers of a fire. The small dried limbs and needles can become kindling over time and can ignite easily due to the concentration of hot lights, and flammable/combustible decorations, including popcorn etc... Make sure Christmas trees are at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or other types of lights.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA):

- One of every three home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes roughly one in every four Christmas tree fires.

### Christmas tree disposal

Never put tree branches or needles in a fireplace or wood-burning stove. When the tree becomes dry, discard it promptly and properly. Robinsons Waste Management will start picking up natural Christmas trees on **January 4, 2016**. Trees must be curbside before 7 A.M. Remember if it is predicable it's preventable!
