With all the snow we've had this winter; many fire hydrants are buried throughout the city.

Keep in mind that firefighters need to access the sides of the hydrant, not just the top. If you have a fire hydrant in front of or adjacent to your home or business, please clear all the snow at least three feet around it on all sides after every snowfall. Make sure that the hydrant is easily visible from the road, and that there is enough room for firefighters to maneuver around it to easily connect fire hoses to it.

Remember, it's the entire neighborhood's responsibility to keep their hydrants clear, since all properties benefit from the protection they provide. Your assistance is appreciated!

PUT A FREEZE ON WINTER FIRES

Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter season, **be fire smart!**

Half of all home heating fires occur in the months of December, January, and February.

Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and **as far away as possible from your house.**

Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least **once a month.**

Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year.**

Heating equipment is involved in **1** in every **6** reported home fires and **1** in every **5** home fire deaths.

Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it outside at least **10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.

Keep anything that can burn at least **3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, or space heaters.

Plug only **1** heat-producing appliance (such as a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.
