## A MESSAGE FROM OUR FIRE CHIEF

Spring is the time for yard clean up and the need to dispose of yard debris. Due to the impact on air quality, local fire departments and the Davis County Fire Board of Appeals including the County Fire Marshal will not allow for open burning in Davis County in 2018.

Exemptions to this are as follows: Farm and horticultural operations may burn as established under current law and air quality rules. In Davis County, a farm or horticultural operation is defined as: (1) fruit orchards of 25 or more fruit trees on a continuous two acre parcel of property, or (2) agricultural activities of 2 or more cultivated acres on single, or contiguous parcels of property. They may only burn products incident to horticulture or agricultural operations, defined as: prunings, diseased plants, stubble and irrigation ditch banks. Before burning, farmers must notify the fire department at 801-614-0840. Such fires must be contained, monitored at all times and put out before dark. The Fire Department has the authority to ask that the fire be put out if it becomes a hazard or a nuisance.

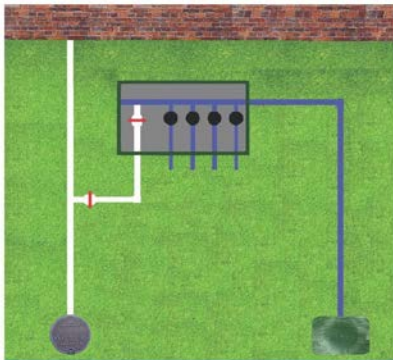
Homeowners may not burn anything, including pruning's, rubbish, debris, or garbage in their yards. Such items should be shredded for mulch or hauled to the local landfill.

Recreational fires may be permitted in an approved fire pit as long as they meet the minimum requirements set forth in Title 10 Fire Prevention in the Clinton City Code which can be found at [www.clintoncity.com](http://www.clintoncity.com). Prior to starting a recreational fire, it is strongly suggested that you contact the Fire Department and give the following information: name, address, & phone number.

## AVOID CROSS CONNECTIONS



An illegal cross connection of the drinking water system (white pipe) and the pressure irrigation system (blue pipe).

A cross connection is any actual or potential connection between the water you want to drink and other sources of undesirable substances (e.g., used water, industrial fluids, etc.) to enter your drinking water. Through our cross-connection control program we provide oversight and monitor connections to our system to alleviate the possibility of water back-

flowing from a consumer, either residential or commercial, into our distribution system. You can do your part by monitoring your own water use and connections within your home or business.

## CERT NEWS

Cert stands for Community Emergency Response Team. We are trained for disasters, large or small that can happen in our communities. During a disaster we may be without water and sewer facilities. The number 1 killer in this case is lack of SANITATION. Follow these steps to avoid serious illnesses. Keep dirty hands away from the mouth. Have a squirt bottle filled with 10 parts water to one part unscented bleach. Spray hands and wipe surfaces frequently with this solution and clean paper towels. Have plastic garbage bag ready to collect all contaminated waste and by products of waste. For a lack of toilet facilities use a 5 gallon bucket lined with a heavy duty garbage bag and a portable toilet lid. Add 2 cups of kitty litter to the bottom of the bag to cut the odor; or, scoop out all the water in the toilet bowl and line it with a garbage bag. **Our main goal is to protect our environment!** Seal bags securely and dig a hole at least 3 feet deep to bury it. Place a marker designating the burial spot. When the disaster is over and the clean up starts, Clinton City will send a truck around to retrieve all of the bags of human and pet waste. It's very important that this waste is not left in the ground. As learned from Hurricane Katrina, human waste can be the cause of many illnesses which could result in deaths.

Please get them trimmed now so that the street sweeper can sweep your street this summer. The City Code (25-16-5) states: "All shrubs and trees shall be pruned to permit plain view of regulatory (street and stop) and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or the sidewalk eight (8) feet."
