CLINTON CITY EMERGENCY CONTACT & NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

If you haven't already done so, now is a good time to sign up for the Clinton City Emergency Contact and Notification System. Or, if you have already signed up, it's a good idea to review your account information and make updates if necessary.

To sign up, click on the **Red Phone** (below) to follow the link to our website at www.clintoncity.com or, go to the website and click on the **Red Phone**. By registering, you can specify how you will receive notifications and you can keep your profile updated with accurate contact information to insure you are notified of important information or an emergency.



Please note that our Emergency Contact System is automatically and regularly updated through our Utility Billing system. If your information on file is not accurate, and you have not registered on our website, you may not receive EMERGENCY NOTICES. Please call our Utilities Department at 801-614-0700 to update your billing information.

If you are an owner of a rental property, please encourage your renters to register for notifications on our website, as this is the only way they will receive notifications or alerts.

When registering, please make sure to respond to the verification email to complete the registration process; check your e-mail including the junk mail folder for your verification email from Cloudspeaker (the provider) and respond to it to complete your registration. Also, check your security settings to allow messages to be delivered to your in box in the future. Thank you!

The Clinton Fire Department just finished an ISO rating inspection which reviews and rates the fire fighting capabilities as well as the water supply system of the City. The City received an outstanding rating of 03/3x (the lower the rating the better)! The City's previous rating has been 04/09. You may want to check with your fire insurance agent to see if this new lower rating will help lower your insurance costs. CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY TIPS

When choosing a natural Christmas tree, always pick one that is fresh and not showing signs of dryness or leaking sap.

Failure to keep a Christmas tree moist and packing it full of lights and decorations increases the dangers of a fire. The small dried limbs and needles can become dry and ignite easily due to the concentration of hot lights, and flammable/combustible decorations, including popcorn etc... Make sure Christmas trees are at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or other types of lights.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA):

- One of every three home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes roughly one in every four Christmas tree fires.

Dispose of trees properly. Christmas Tree Pick Up dates are Tuesday January 8 and Wednesday January 9, 2019. Please have trees curbside by 6 am on Tuesday morning. Thank you!!
