IMPORTANT WINTER INFORMATION AND TIPS

Sidewalk Snow Removal

Please remember that ALL Clinton City property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks along their property or business clear of snow and ice. Do not deposit snow in the street. Also, please keep bushes and trees near the sidewalks trimmed to provide a clear safe path for pedestrians.

Winter Parking

Winter Parking is in effect November 15th to March 15th. NO OVERNIGHT PARKING is allowed from midnight to 7:00 am no matter what the weather conditions are. Contact the Police Dept at 801-614-0800 with questions.

Snow Plows

Snow plows do their best to keep our roads clear and safe during snow storms. Please be patient and courteous to our drivers who work long hours, often on holidays and/or through the night clearing the snow from our streets. Major Roads and collector streets are plowed first followed by residential streets and cul-de-sacs.

Winter Driving

Please take the time to clear your windows of snow and ice before driving and drive slowly in inclement weather especially when approaching intersections & near schools.

Vehicle Theft and Burglaries

Please do not leave your vehicles unattended or unlocked while they are warming up.

Removing snow from around hydrants is a crucial part of fire Safety!

Be aware that snow-covered fire hydrants can delay fire services. If there is a fire hydrant near your home, please clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work in case of a fire (at least 3 feet). Clear the path from the hydrant to the street. Doing this can save responders precious seconds or minutes when responding to a fire.

A Message from the Davis & Weber Counties Canal Company

The 2018 water season was less than normal, and the summer was hot and dry. Reservoirs were depleted. This year, the watershed snowpack is basically at average (100-105%) and it is unknown if the reservoirs will completely fill. We continue to encourage efficient water use, conserving where possible. Please adjust your watering based on the weather. Strive to only water your yard based on its ‘need’. The Utah State website (<http://www.conservewater.utah.gov/>) states “the typical Utah household will use twice as much water outside as necessary.” We encourage all users to reference the State website for their weekly watering guide. Often there is no need to water until May.

Meters are required on all new secondary water services and have begun to be retrofit to existing services. We are sending water use reports to those with meters in an effort to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources. Please contact (meters@davisweber.org) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly.

Thank you in advance for your water conservation efforts this upcoming water season; we want to continue the state ethic of efficiently using water in a wise manner. Visit www.davisweber.org, for further updates or restrictions. Remember to ensure your system is ready for service by April 1st when pressurization of the system will begin.

A Message from the Davis County Health Department

29.1 million Americans have diabetes and 86 million have prediabetes--that’s nearly one in three! It’s important to learn about these chronic conditions and take action now. Are you at risk? Take this quiz at DoIHavePrediabetes.org to find out.

To address this growing issue, the Davis County Health Department offers the National Diabetes Prevention Program (PreventT2) to Davis County residents. PreventT2 is a research-based program designed to promote healthy lifestyle changes that have been proven to prevent or delay the development of type 2 diabetes over the course of 26 one-hour sessions. Topics include healthy eating, physical activity, how to face daily challenges of behavior change and more.
